Welcome back to a new and exciting school year! I hope this message finds you refreshed and energized after the summer break, ready to dive into another year of learning, growth, and achievement. Whether you're returning or joining us for the first time, we are thrilled to have you as part of our CTS community.

As we embark on this journey together, our focus remains on fostering a supportive, inclusive, and dynamic environment where every student can thrive. Our inquiry question is, "what are the most powerful ways we can foster a nurturing and identity-affirming learning environment?" Our dedicated team of educators has been hard at work preparing for the year

ahead, ensuring that we continue to deliver the highest quality education while also promoting the social and emotional well-being of our students.

This year, we have several new initiatives and programs aimed at enhancing student engagement, academic success, and personal development. We are working on developing our tiered support model to ensure all students are achieving, we are continuing to develop our student leadership programs, in which students are working with I-Think to continue our work with our Vision and Mission, and we are looking to create more identify-affirming spaces and clubs to support well-being. Teachers are committed to continue to develop their anti-oppressive assessment and instructional practices. We have changed our Library space into a dynamic learning space where students can seek support from a caring adult, engage in learning and access activities. Finally, we are committed to keeping our communication open and transparent, so please don't hesitate to reach out if you have any questions, concerns, or ideas to share. Together, we can make this year the best one yet.

This fall we had a very large increase in student enrollment, much more than the planning department had projected. This has resulted in very large class sizes and in some cases not being able to timetable students adequately. We have had to make some changes to student timetables to alleviate some very large classes. We realize that change can be difficult for students once they have made a connection with a teacher and routines have been established; however, our staff will work closely with one another and the students to minimize the impact that reorganization will have on their routines.

As well there are still some classes without a regular teacher. We are working closely with People and Culture (formally known as employee services) to recruit and hire new teachers to the board and ultimately CTS. ACLs and other teachers are doing their best to support classes without a teacher, to keep those students engaged in learning.

I recognize that parents and caregivers play a vital role in our schools. I welcome the opportunity to partner with parents, caregivers and community as their involvement will positively benefit teaching and learning at the school. This monthly newsletter is one tool through which I hope to provide information and updates about the school and opportunities to participate in school life at Central Tech!

## **National Day for Truth and Reconciliation**



Truth and Reconciliation Week took place on September 23-27th, and on **Monday**, **September 30**<sup>th</sup> was the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation and Orange Shirt day. Staff and students were encouraged to wear orange to honour the thousands of Survivors of residential schools. Wearing an orange shirt is a National movement to

recognize the experience of those who went to Residential Schools, to honour them and show a collective commitment to ensure that **EVERY CHILD MATTERS**. Students and staff were asked to continue to listen, learn from, and center the lived experiences of Indigenous Nations and people, and to reflect on the impact of residential schools on Indigenous Peoples, their legacy, and to recognize their strength and resilience. As well they were prompted: **to what extent are you taking meaningful action in addition to symbolic action?** 

## **Morning Snack/Meal and Lunch Program:**

This year, thanks to funding from The Toronto Foundation for Student Success and The City of Toronto, we will continue providing the following Nutrition Services: Breakfast and Morning Meal, and Lunch.

Breakfast and Morning Meal will be available daily from 8:30am until 9:00am, and on late start days, 9:30am to 10:00am in our Cafeteria. Yoghurt, fruit, granola, bread, cereal, and other items will be available for student to consume in the cafeteria. Late students will find extra food available just outside of Guidance (Room 205).



This Program will begin Monday, September 30<sup>th</sup>, 2024. This Program replaces the previous

model of classrooms sending one student to pick up their Morning Meal from the Cafeteria. Breakfast/Morning Meal will be on an individual student basis, not per class.

Please note, food served in the cafeteria in the morning needs to be consumed in the cafeteria and all cutlery and dishes need to be placed in the used dishes bin provided nearby. Students cannot take their food/bowls/plates/cutlery to their classroom and return later.

This year, we are partnering with Fantasy Kitchen. Fantasy Kitchen is a restaurant located at 195 Harbord Street, right across the road from our School's Harbord Street side (it is a white building). Fantasy Kitchen will be providing delicious and healthy lunches for our students for \$6. For students needing a subsidy, lunch will cost \$3 on Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays. To access the subsidy, students will need to enquire with Guidance (Room 205) and obtain a CTS Lunch Card Subsidized costs will not apply if a student does not have this card. *Students, please speak to your Guidance Counsellor this week about obtaining the CTS Lunch Card*. This Program will begin Monday, September 30<sup>th</sup>.

## **Library Learning Commons**

It has been a busy first month in the CTS <u>Library Learning Commons</u> (LLC) as 82 classes have used the space to date. This has been a fantastic start as we begin our transition from a traditional library to an LLC. In addition to the ongoing arrival of new books, the LLC has received 25 new Chromebooks that students can sign out and use in the space. We have also created a new area to accommodate an entire class and a spot for students to engage in silent reading and/or mindfulness activities.





To honour Truth and Reconciliation Week, we created a display to showcase some of the Indigenous literature from our collection and welcomed the addition of this rug recognizing the Seven Grandfather Teachings.
