Re-Imagining Learning at CTS:

13 students at CTS have been working closely with staff and I-Think of the Rotman Institute (UofT) to reimagine learning at CTS, and create CTS's new vision and mission, and develop a plan to actualize them. To date, students have led focus groups in classes asking, and have led open ended interviews with leaders within and outside of











the TDSB who can stretch our thinking on what school can look, sound and feel like for our students and our staff. I am very thankful that I was able to observe and listen most of our students in action and see the interviews they had with Mike Gallagher (a retired Superintendent of Education), Nick Bertrand (an Indigenous Education officer at the Ministry of Education) and Colleen Russell Rawlins (the Director of Education of the Toronto District School Board). I was left feeling both inspired and hopeful after listening to the incredibly thoughtful questions the students created, and the probing questions they came up with during the interview, demonstrating their listening skills. Next, students will look at the data they retrieved from the interviews and determine themes to help them start to craft a vision and mission.

Visual Arts

Grade 10 LAWS:

On Friday, November 25 students from the grade 10 class of our LAWS program went on a field trip to the University of Toronto Faculty of Law for the LAWS 101 workshops prepared by the LAWS staff. In one workshop, students participated in a Mock Trial where they were given a case and prepared arguments as either the crown or the defense lawyers. In the second workshop, students were given the opportunity to see how the Law can be a part of all aspects of society - from A to Z. Students were given the opportunity to think critically about issues of justice, injustice, and how the legal system affects both. We are thankful to the LAWS program for a fun and thought provoking afternoon.

Students can share a common passion or interest with a mentor with the goal of building their capacity to make informed decisions about their future before leaving school and transitioning to community and workplaces. Teachers are looking forward to connecting interested students with the Community Links Mentors so they can explore their passions and start planning for transitions after graduation.
