Black History Month:

Each February, the contributions of Black people to Canadian society are recognized and celebrated to acknowledge the 400-year presence of people of African descent in this country. African Heritage Month provides the opportunity for our community to learn more about and celebrate the diversity and richness of the histories and heritages of the African Diaspora.

As part of our CTS's school improvement goal, we ask, "what are the most powerful ways to foster nurturing and identity-affirming learning environments?" We know when Black students and staff can thrive and grow, without barriers, their sense of self worth and belonging grows.

We are committed to understanding and dismantling anti-Black racism and will look to eliminate the conditions created by systemic racism. We hope then our Black students' identity will be affirmed and able to thrive in our classrooms and school community.

Some of the activities we will be doing are:

February 2nd: Staff will engage in learning with Itah Sadu. Itah will share and celebrate the stories of Black men and women who were trailblazers in Toronto and were the cornerstone to our community at Bloor and Bathurst. Staff will listen to these stories and collaborate on

ways to celebrate these folks in their curricula, and on how to partner with the cultural centre to ensure more inclusive and identify-affirming topics and assessments in our classes.

February 8th: Students and staff are invited to come together at lunch and watch "Giants of Africa" in Room 263.

February 13th: Neil "Logik" Donaldson from SFA (Stolen from Africa) will do a lunchtime presentation on Black Canadian History.

February 15th: Classes will be invited to attend a lecture and Q&A with Dr. Clyde Ledbetter Jr. on the theme of "The Importance of Teaching Pre-Colonial African Histories."

February 16th: Students will be given the opportunity to watch "Black Panther: Wakanda Forever."

February 22nd: Field Trip to MSLE Launchpad for a "Black Students Day" celebration.

February 23rd: The Black Students' Alliance (BSA) will be hosting a COOK OUT! Students will be given the opportunity at lunch time to purchase a variety of African and Caribbean dishes. Yummy!

February 24th: There will be a school-wide assembly featuring Randell Adjei, who is an amazing arts educator, motivational speaker, the founder of R.I.S.E (Reaching Intelligent Souls Everywhere), and the first poet Laureate of Toronto!

February 27th: Students will be invited to attend a guest presentation by a representative from the Canadian Black Nurses Alliance (CBNA). Q&A to follow.

February 28th: Black-identifying students are invited to participate in a photo shoot for a "I am Part of Black Excellence" display.

*Also, throughout the month, there will be short films and documentaries shown in Room 210, 208, 211, 263. There will be an opportunity for students to discuss after each viewing.
