

Celebrating African Heritage Month: Honouring Our Legacy and Embracing Our Future



February is a significant month as we celebrate African Heritage Month, also known as Black History Month. This is an important opportunity for our students, staff, and families to learn about, honour, and celebrate the rich history and contributions of Black Canadians and Black communities around the world. This year, the Toronto District School Board proudly recognizes African Heritage Month with the theme "Lift Every Voice," inspired by the first line of the Black National Anthem. This powerful theme encourages collective strength and unity within the African/Black diaspora, celebrating the vibrant and diverse cultures, experiences, and achievements of our community. At CTS, all students have engaged in learning about Black identity, resilience, and joy, while also examining the systems of

Throughout February, our Black students at CTS have actively engaged in conferences, celebrations, and enriching learning experiences. Notably, our ACDC club co-created



"Black Love Day," where students participated in student-led workshops focused on Black Love, culminating in an inspiring keynote address by Ms. Elaine from the Blackhurst Cultural Centre.

Additionally, students attended the Black Student Day event hosted by MLSE, where they

Anishinaabe: **maamawi** (courtesy of the *The Ojibwe People's Dictionary*; includes pronunciation)

Haudenosaunee: Entsitewahwe'nón:ni ne 'onkwa'nikón:ra ("We will put our minds together"; courtesy of *First Voices*)

Wendat: **Titsatont tsindiahay!** ("Let's all eat together from the same plate!"; courtesy of the *Dictionary of the Wendat Language*)

Level Up Day

We are excited to share important information about our ongoing support for student success at CTS. In addition to our continuous Credit Rescue initiatives, we will be hosting two special "Level-Up Days" this semester—one in Term 1 and one in Term 2—designed to help students improve their academic standing.



What is Credit Rescue?

Credit Rescue is a proactive approach that involves collaboration between classroom teachers and Student Success Teachers. It provides students with additional opportunities to complete missing assignments and improve their grades when there is a risk of not earning their credit. Instead of waiting for Credit Recovery options, we implement Credit Rescue to support student success throughout the course.

Please note that while there will be designated times for Credit Rescue, opportunities will be available continuously throughout the semester for students who need assistance.

Level-Up Day Details

Our first Level-Up Day will take place on Friday, March 7th. This day is specifically designed for students who are currently earning less than a level 1 (50%) in their classes, giving them a chance to catch up on outstanding work. However, students earning a level 1 or above are also encouraged to participate—they can use this time to work on assignments, study for upcoming tests, and help classmates who may be struggling. We believe that in a strong community, we support one another in achieving success!

It's important to note that on Level-Up Day, no new material will be introduced; it will be a regular school day, and attendance will be taken for all students. We expect everyone to be present and engaged.
