A message from your Principal - Anne Chirakal

Welcome to the 2023-2024 school year! I have really enjoyed connecting with our students and families over this last month and look forward to meeting many more in the days ahead. Welcome to all of our new families and staff - you have joined a terrific community!

We have had an amazing start to the year. Over 175 students attended our Head Start to Highschool, a day to support grade 9's transitioning to highschool, and more than 100 parents participated in our information breakfast. Lots of clubs and extracurricular activities have already started and your students are fully enjoying life at CTS!

As part of our CTS Strategy (Student created), our new vision and mission is: Our vision is that every student leaves CTS with:

- A love of learning
- The real-world skills to choose their next steps
- A strong sense of self and other

For this vision to come to life, our mission is to make Central Technical School a place of:

- Student-centered imagination and action
- Cultural enlightenment
- Safety

As part of our learning and unlearning together, staff and students have determined their commitments to the vision and mission, actions, timelines and metrics (how do we know it is working?) and this will be visible throughout the school soon. This fall we had a very large increase in student enrollment, much more than the planning department had projected. This has resulted in very large class sizes and in some cases not being able to timetable students adequately. We have learned that we will be hiring four new teachers. This will help to alleviate class sizes and hopefully provide more options for students and their timetables. Unfortunately, these changes will likely impact a lot of student timetables as we work through this process.

The process will be occurring as soon as possible to lessen the impact on student learning. We realize that change can be difficult for students once they have made a connection with a teacher and routines have been established; however, our staff will work closely with one another and the students to minimize the impact that reorganization will have on their routines.

I recognize that parents and caregivers play a vital role in our schools. I welcome the opportunity to partner with parents, caregivers and community as their involvement will positively benefit teaching and learning at the school. This monthly newsletter is one tool through which I hope to provide information and updates about the school and opportunities to participate in school life at Central Tech!

On that note, our first **School Council** meeting took place on **Tuesday, September 26th**. I am happy to report that I was able to meet so many parents/caregivers and I am excited to continue coming together! National Day for Truth and Reconciliation

On September 29th, the TDSB and Central Technical School recognized Orange shirt day to commemorate the legacy of Residential Schools. Commemoration of the tragic



and painful history and the ongoing impacts of Residential Schools is a vital component of the reconciliation process. Students and staff wore orange shirts as schools explored resources to help students understand the difficult history of residential schools. The orange shirt is a symbol of the stripping away of culture, freedom and self-esteem experienced by Indigenous children over generations. Students and staff were asked to continue to listen, learn from, and center the lived experiences of Indigenous Nations and people, and

to reflect on the impact of residential schools on Indigenous Peoples, their legacy, and to recognize their strength and resilience. As well they were prompted: **to what extent are you taking meaningful action in addition to symbolic action?**

Ms. Mughal's English class for students with MID:



Extracurriculars: played on the Senior Boys Basketball team

What Alex is doing now?: After wrapping up my undergrad at York University in Sociology and playing some university basketball in the prairies, I ventured into the screen industries and started my own podcast "The Gifted Gab." This led to co-founding other groundbreaking movements including the Collective for Black Iranians, and my production company Gamble Ave Filmworks. My love for film started at Central Tech, after taking a media studies class with Mr. Chandler. The philosophical discussions paired with a new way of looking at storytelling and media was birthed right in the halls and classrooms of CTS. I vividly remember a discussion in class about the camera technique shot in a specific scene in the movie Goodfellas that changed the way I would watch movies for the rest of my life. Going from appreciating stories to asking "how was that shot done?" really gave me a new lens to appreciate the world with. It was one of several decisions I made while a student at Tech, which led to my long, introspective journey into the storytelling world, and it started when I was a 17 year old student. These intentional decisions come full circle as I prepare to screen my debut documentary project "Coaching While Black" at the Reelworld Film Festival in Toronto after its world premiere at Calgary International Film Festival.

Alex recently shared his experiences with Ms. Tsouluhas' Dismantling Black Racism class, and hopes to screen his film at CTS in the future.
