OYAP

Ontario Youth Apprenticeship Program

How does the program work?

Semester 1: Students receive specialized training in the trade of their choice in in a multi credit course, giving them the skills necessary to enter an apprenticeship directly from high school.

Semester 2 full day co-op placement to further develop their skills and build a relationship with an employer. Most students get hired directly after completion of the program and begin their apprenticeship.

What sectors do we offer?

Electrical, Plumbing, Carpentry, Cooking, Cosmetology, and Transportation Specialized OYAP program at Central Technical School

Who do we accept?

Students who are within 8 credits or less of graduation or students who have already graduated and will be 20 years old or less in September 2024. Students should be ready to go to work directly after the program.

How to Apply: Central Tech Specialized OYAP Applications Now in ELIS

- For students in their final year of high school, or those who have recently graduated.
- Your Guidance Counsellor must complete an application through ELIS.
- If you are no longer in Day School, please contact Mr. Rasmussen directly.
- Applications received by January 26, 2024 will be given equal consideration.





- If you are NOT a current TDSB student, and Central Technical School appears in your search result, an <u>online TDSB</u> <u>Registration Form</u> and **Grade 9 Course Selection Sheet** must be completed.
 - The Online application form will be open from January 8 to January 26, 2024 at 4 p.m

- Beginning January 8, 2024 request from, then return a completed copy of our Grade 9 Course Selection Sheet from/to Kim.Farewell@tdsb.on.ca
- Completed Course Selection Sheets are due by February
 26, 2024



Out-of-Area Admission

Applicants will apply online through a central application that will be posted on the Out-of-Area Admissions website posted here:

Only one Out-of-Area Admissions application is permitted.

Application Timelines

January 8, 2024 - Secondary Out-of-Area Admissions Online application opens

January 26, 2024 (4:00 p.m.) - Secondary Out-of-Area Admissions Online application closes



Acceptance Timelines

February 7, 2024 - Families to be informed of the status of the application

February 13, 2024 - Families must confirm acceptance of the offer

February 14, 2024 - Families to be informed of the status of the application

February 20, 2024 - Families must confirm acceptance of the offer

February 21, 2024 - Families to be informed of the final status of the application request.

All waitlists expire on February 21, 2024

February 23, 2024 - Families must confirm acceptance of the offer

February 26, 2024.- TDSB Students must finalize their acceptance by completing and submitting the corresponding course selection for the accepted school in myBlueprint.



Specialized Visual Arts Program Admission

- REGARDLESS OF HOME ADDRESS ALL STUDENTS MUST APPLY THROUGH THE Secondary Central Student Interest Programs process.
- The application window is November 6 24 (4pm), 2023.
- All completed applications are then entered into the lottery system.

Application Process - Expression of Interest

Expression of Interest Limits

 Written/text-based submissions - student original work with a maximum of 1000 words

OR

 Audio/Video recordings - maximum 5 minutes - a performance by the student OR a performance of someone else's composition identifying who they are accompanied by a brief description of how the work has influenced you

OR

 Digital versions of students' artwork or projects - maximum 3 original student work samples **OR** maximum 3 pieces of artwork with the artist(s) identified accompanied by a brief description of how the work has influenced you



Admissions to Programming



Centralized random selection process (lottery) will be used if there are more applicants than there are spaces in the program

Note: students who reside in the City of Toronto will be accommodated before students who reside outside of the city.

All students with a passion and interest are welcome in TDSB central student interest programs and schools.



Supporting Underserved Communities

As part of the random selection process:

- First Nations, Métis and Inuit applicants will be seated in their Primary Program choice in the entry grade
- A portion of seats will be filled by applicants from historically and currently underserved communities, a reflection of the TDSB demographic for students selfidentifying as Black, Latino, Latina or Latinx and Middle Eastern.



Acceptances: Timelines

The random selection process will occur centrally and all communication will come from the Board. Please do not contact schools directly for selection results.

- December 7, 2023 Acceptances and waitlist status will be <u>sent</u> centrally, via email to all applicants. Offers expire December 13, 2023 at 4:00 p.m.
- December 14, 2023 Second round of Acceptances and waitlist status will be sent centrally, via email to all applicants. Offers expire December 20, 2023 at 4:00 p.m.
- Offers will continue to be made in January until February 21, 2024. Central Waitlists will expire after this date.
