

Central Tech is home to one of the most comprehensive English as a Second Language programs in the TDSB. We offer core classes from levels A to E. Our beginner and intermediate levels are paired with language-support courses, which help our students acquire language more quickly and effectively.

In addition, our significant ELL (English Language Learner) population allows us to offer several ESL-supported courses in various subject areas, including math, science and Canadian history.

Additionally, we provide intensive support to newcomer students who have experienced significant gaps in education in their home countries, in our LEAP (Literacy Enrichment Academic Program) courses.

Central Tech is also home to SWIS (Settlement Workers in Schools), who, under the auspices of Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada, provide supports to newcomer students and their families.



ACCESSIBLE ART MATERIALS

At Central Tech we understand that not everyone has equal access to high quality art materials, and it is important to us that every student no matter their financial situation can participate in all lessons. Students are provided with high quality sketchbooks and pencils to take home and work in throughout the year, and are encouraged to take advantage of the various tools and materials available in class.

SPECIALIZED FACILITIES

SCULPTURE ROOM AND CERAMICS

Students learn how to do subtractive and additive sculpture, make molds and casts, as well as throw and fire pottery with the help of skilled technicians. Our sculpture studio is home to the largest kiln in the TDSB, as well as the only bronze foundry in the TDSB. Our building has spaces for life modeling, casting, carving, as well as a fabrication pit for construction and welding.

DIGITAL MEDIA LAB

Students also have access to Adobe products such as Photoshop, InDesign, and Illustrator. All of these resources are used in non-traditional art classes, but are available to all art classes throughout the year.

PHOTOGRAPHY AND DARKROOMS

Students taking photography classes have access to a darkroom and different digital and film cameras.

OUR LEARNING ENVIRONMENT

Students attending the Central Tech art program will typically take one art class each semester – a traditional class and a nontraditional class. The art teachers at Central Tech are all skilled artists that come from many different creative backgrounds outside of teaching. With each teacher's unique skill set comes a different way to look at art and to be taught, encouraging a wide skill set to be learned by the students as they take classes each year. Each instructor's teaching environment is unique and allows a student to develop a well rounded set of skills and styles as an artist.

SHSM - SPECIALIST HIGH SKILLS MAJORS

These innovative programs let high school students in Grades 11 and 12 focus on a career path that matches their skills and interests while earning their Ontario Secondary School Diploma.

Through specialized programming, students are given the opportunity to reach ahead and experience relevant training and learning specific to their sector of study.

Our students will participate in a variety of experiential learning opportunities in the community and complete several sectorspecific certifications.

Students who successfully complete all requirements earn a special seal on their diploma and receive a record card outlining the specialized courses and certifications they have earned.

A SHSM assists students in their transition from secondary school into apprenticeship training, college, university or the workplace.

On Graduation

Students who complete the requirements for the OSSD and SHSM will receive an OSSD with an **embossed SHSM seal** on it. Credits earned towards the SHSM are indicated on the Provincial Report Card, and completion of the SHSM is recorded on the Ontario Student Transcript (OST). In addition, students receive an SHSM Record outlining their achievement in the five required components.


