

It is important to recognize that while Pride can be a celebration, that at its root it is led by trans women of colour, a protest fighting for intersectional rights. Reminders of homophobia and transphobia, pressures to come out, present a certain way, or to "fit in" with the community are real and ongoing. Resources for support (helplines, community resources, etc.) to acknowledge that Pride isn't a celebration for everybody were also shared with students.

The Progress Pride Flag, includes black, brown, white, pink, and blue stripes to centre racialized and transgender members of the community who face additional forms of oppression was raised at CTS last month.

SUMMER SCHOOL COURSE OFFERED BY DIFFERENT BOARDS

Original final report cards of courses taken through different boards must be submitted to your counsellor in order for it to be added to your transcript.

If you are planning on registering for summer school through a different board and have applied to college or university, your counsellor must add this to your academic profile. Speak to your counsellor if this is the case.

University and College Applicants:

If you have accepted offers to programs you are expected to pay a deposit to hold your seat. Amounts and deadlines vary between institutions. Check your post-secondary emails regularly to stay abreast of your next steps.

If you have not received offers go to www.ontariocollege.ca to search for open college programs and ouac for Ontario University programs with open seats.

OSAP - Ontario Student Assistance Program:

As soon as a student has accepted an offer, they may apply for OSAP to help fund their tuition for the post-secondary education.
