From the History, Geography and Social Science Department:

Geography, Academic Pathway Grade 9:

Grade 9 Geography students have been going on walking excursions in the community to strengthen their orienteering skills. Also, they explored the CTS community and did a "Climate Change in our Neighbourhood" activity. For this they collected data, made heat maps with the data in ArcGIS and then did a geographic analysis of the information.

The LAWS Program at Central Tech continues to provide 'Virtual' Programming for our LAWS Cohort, which during Quadrants 3 and 4 will connect with our Grade 12 Law class, our Grade 11 Law class, our Grade 10 Science class, and our ESL E class.



This week, for example, York University Osgoode Hall Law students presented an On-Line Workshop to our Grade 12s on Mediation and Alternative Dispute Resolution (ADR).

Also, the LAWS staff is currently conducting a Mock Trial Program with our Quadrant 3 ESL E class - it is a Criminal Law scenario entitled R. v. Lee, in which our students learn courtroom procedure, direct examination, cross examination, opening and closing statements, and application of actual laws and precedent cases in a Courtroom setting.

Central Tech/OISE-UT Partnership continues:

Central Tech's unique partnership with the Ontario Studies in Education at University of Toronto has continued these past 4 weeks. CTS hosted 8 Masters of Teaching Teacher Candidates from OISE in various subject areas, including Law, Geography, English, and Business Education. CTS continues to provide leadership and mentoring in the area of bringing new candidates into the teaching profession. Central Tech is indeed an all-encompassing teaching institution.
