African Heritage Month Activities:

As part of our CTS's school improvement goal, we ask, "what are the most powerful ways to foster nurturing and identity-affirming learning environments?" We know when Black students and staff can thrive and grow, without barriers, their sense of self worth and belonging grows.

Some activities our classes engaged in to celebrate African Heritage Month but to also learn about and question themes of anti-Black racism and oppression are:

In Grade 11 English, classes previewed a Pixar short called Hair Love:

The students then discussed narrative structure as well as themes such as black hair and acceptance as well as challenged and questioned the stereotypes of Black men and their roles in the family.





In the workplace bound program, our KCW class (exploring our world), examined the history of their families and how they came to Canada. They clipped photos and sorted them into culture, nature and Canadian attractions. We watched a video and talked about the groups that are represented and not represented in this survey of Canada and where our Indgenous communities exist on the map.

In the Foods and Hospitality Grade 12 class, explored African Food Culture in Nova Scotia, and critically examined concepts of Black food sovereignty, the resurgence of cultural pride, including African Nova Scotian Flag, the creation of Afrocentric education and the launch of soul food restaurants in the largest and oldest Black settlement in Canada, the outskirts of North Preston.
