Carrying Testimony - From Generation to Generation

On Thursday the Board recognized Holocaust and Heroism Remembrance Day. To honour this day, CTS took part in a school-wide assembly with Michelle Glied-Goldstein from <u>Carrying</u> <u>Testimony</u>. Michelle used video, photographs and interview clips with her father to share and provide a powerful learning experience for students and staff about the Holocaust. The presentation was incredibly moving and memorable. The presentation ended with Michelle reminding us the importance of kindness and words from her father:

"First, when you leave, kiss the ground you stand on because we are so lucky to live in a great country like Canada. But, it's up to each one of us to make sure it continues to be the kind of country and society we want to be a part of. Second, when you go home, hug and kiss your parents/guardians/grandparents – who ever looks after you and loves you – because no matter how hard you may sometimes think it is to live with them, I knew how hard it was to live without them. Finally, find a way to do one kind thing today. It doesn't need to be a big thing – hold the door open for some, say "Hi" to someone you pass in the hall everyday but never acknowledge, invite someone to join your basketball game, bring in the groceries, whatever it is – do one kind thing. Because if each one of us can do one kind thing, together, we can make the world a much better place."
