



CITI Motive Power Program 2016-2017

Accelerated Level 1 OYAP Program at Winston Churchill C.I. in Partnership With Centennial College

Students from any school in the TDSB can apply, even if they do not have an existing transportation program. They just require a strong enthusiasm for the transportation industry and are able to commit for 2 years to the program. Please read this application and information fully and completely.

Grade 11 (YEAR 1) and GRADE 12 (YEAR 2)

The Toronto District School Board has partnered with the Toronto Catholic District School Board, the Government of Ontario – Ministry of Advanced Education and Skills Development (MAESD, formerly MTCU), Industry Partners and Centennial College to offer this opportunity for students who are interested in pursuing careers as **Automotive Service Technicians**

As a participant in this Ontario Youth Apprenticeship Program, students will:

- earn credits towards their high school diplomas;
- register as apprentices with the Ministry;
- work towards completion of Level 1 of their apprenticeship;
- network with people that can help them further their careers;

During the 2nd Semester **Year 1** students will take a **Transportation Technology** course at Winston Churchill CI and **Pre-Apprenticeship** classes at Centennial College (Ashtonbee Campus) for the first half of the semester (afternoons only), and be on a **Cooperative Education** work placement during the afternoons, the second half.

Students who are successful will also earn 1 additional Dual Credit.

Student's Schedule: Year 1

**Students have the option of remaining registered at their home school or transferring to Winston Churchill C.I. (if the home school does not have an appropriate timetable for this program).*

Student's Schedule: Year 2

Feb. 8 –26	Pre-placement All day	Winston Churchill CI (Transportation Technology, Pre-Placement & Pre-Apprenticeship)
Feb 29 – April 22	All day	Level 1 Apprenticeship Training at Centennial College
Apr 27 – June 17	All day	Co-op Placement

Students must understand they are making a two-year commitment to the program.



Year 2 is a 4-credit component (full days second semester):

- four weeks of Pre-Placement and Ministry mandated curriculum
- eight weeks at Centennial College for **Automotive Service Technician Level 1** (Level 1 trade-school)
- eight weeks at a cooperative education work placement
- Students who are successful will also earn 2 additional Dual Credits

Note: Entrance into the Year 2 portion is dependent upon the student's successful completion of the Year 1. (A few spaces may be available for Year 2 for advanced placement students who have completed a selection of TTJ courses. Please call for information.)

In addition to being at least 16 years of age, students selected for interviews will have:

- accumulated at least 16 credits** before February 2016,
- earned an average of (or near) 70%;
- completed a CITI Motive Power application;
- included a Cover Letter, Resume, Credit Counselling Summary, and Attendance.

*** It would be beneficial to have completed a Grade 11 Automotive course and discovered an aptitude and passion for that type of hands-on work with awareness of the importance of safety.*

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Centennial College (Ashtonbee Campus – North of Eglinton and Warden) will host an **Information Night** for parents and students on Wednesday, **October 26, 2016 from 7:00 – 9:00 pm**. Application packages can be picked up at that time and are due to Chris Tustin at Winston Churchill C.I. by **November 18, 2016**.

A committee of educators and employers will review every application. Since there are a limited number of spaces in this program, employers and educators will interview suitable applicants based on the application submissions.

Students from any school in the TDSB can apply, even if they do not have an existing transportation program. They just require a strong enthusiasm for the transportation industry and are able to commit for 2 years to the program.

The student should complete the application form (available on the Information Night or at your school through student services, or online on the oyaptdsb.com website) together with a guidance, technology or cooperative education teacher. Applicants require Principal's approval and Parental/Guardian consent.

Those selected for an interview must ensure that they are available from **6:00 to 9:30 pm** at Centennial College (Ashtonbee Campus) on **December 5, 2016**. Interviews will be 20 minutes in duration and include questions that will provide you with an opportunity to demonstrate your suitability to the program. At the very least, every candidate will be asked the question that follows:

Why should an employer connected to the CITI: Motive Power Program hire you?

Those interviewed will be assessed on the following criteria:

- **Personal Presentation, Communication Skills, Attitude, Motivation**

Applicants are encouraged to consult with their parents, technology teachers, guidance counsellors or a cooperative education teacher as they complete and submit the application package and prepare for their interviews.
