# Weather Guidelines

#### Other conditions:

Weather conditions change during the day. When necessary and if the weather is questionable, the school principal will consult Environment Canada's the www.weatheroffice.ec.gc.ca or Toronto Public Health Web sites for information.

Any staff member may voice weather concerns to the principal for consideration prior to the next scheduled recess. During extreme weather conditions, parents and students may wait inside the school up to 15 minutes prior to the entry or dismissal bells.

**Be Prepared!** Dress for the Weather!



Toronto Public Health is recommending that whenever students and staff experience flu-like symptoms, they are sent home and do not return to school until they are no longer infectious to others.
