Buses and Winter Weather

From time to time, it may be necessary to cancel student transportation, classes and/or programs because of severe weather. On rare occasions, severe weather makes it necessary to close schools, administrative offices or sites.

With approximately 235,000 students in 583 schools, any decision to cancel buses, classes and/or programs or to close sites can have a



significant impact on thousands of families across Toronto. This decision is not taken lightly. When schools remain open on days with inclement weather, parents/

guardians make the final decision on whether to send their children to school and they can keep children home from school if they so choose.

Parents/Guardians of our Gifted students who take a school bus, be sure to sign up for <u>Bus</u> <u>Planner</u> to get information about your child's transportation.

Reducing Spread of Illness

Punctuality & Attendance



As a school staff we are concerned about students who are struggling to arrive at school on time. We want our students to be successful and to feel prepared and confident. Students can only

do this if they develop appropriate skills throughout their elementary years.

Being late is a habit. When a student is late for school it disrupts the learning environment of all the other students in the class. Classmates and the teacher are distracted by the individual's late arrival and often forced to wait for this individual to get settled and ready to learn. All students must respect the fact that what they do affects others.

Arriving on time is a life skill. At this time we are asking for your support in ensuring your child is able to arrive at school on time, both in the morning and after lunch. Students should arrive no later than 8:10 a.m. to enter the building with their class for 8:15 a.m. and 12:00 p.m. after lunch. Please support your child in establishing a schedule that permits ample time to get ready and travel to school so that they can meet these timelines, especially in winter weather.


