We have had a very exciting start to the New Year. In January, we enjoyed seeing students sharing their work in our monthly Sharing Circle. Here, students are selected to show their learning in front of the school as a way for us to build community at Cliffside. We also had the Planetarium visiting Cliffside! Every class at Cliffside got a chance to "blast" into space! Students learned about the different planets in our solar system, and learned about how different starts near each other form different constellations in the sky that we can identify at night. It was certainly an experience to remember!
























THE PLANETARIUM VISITS CLIFFSIDE – JANUARY 30, 2024




















FEBRUARY IS AFRICAN HERITAGE MONTH

In preparation for African Heritage Month, the Grade 7/8 students in Mr. Cabrera's class prepared interesting facts about famous black Canadians and Americans to share each day over the announcements. Here are some of those interesting facts:

Did you know... Black History Month is an annual observance originating in the United States, where it is also known as African-American History Month. It has received official recognition from governments in the United States and Canada, and more recently has been observed in Ireland and the United Kingdom.

Did you know... James McCune Smith was the first African-American person to get a medical degree from the University of Glasgow in Glasgow Scotland. He also started America's first Black-owned pharmacy. He was the first African-American to have their work published in a peer reviewed medical journal.

Did you know...

Automatic Elevator Doors were invented by Alexander Miles in 1887. Before automatic doors, people had to manually shut both the shaft and elevator doors before riding. Forgetting to do so led to multiple accidents.

Did you know... Shirley Anita St. Hill Chisholm was the first African American woman in Congress in 1968, and the first woman and African American to seek the Democratic Party nomination for President of the United States in 1972. While announcing her candidacy for President, she stated, "I am the candidate of the people and my presence before you symbolizes a new era in American political history."

Did you know... Mathieu Da Costa was the first documented free Black person to arrive in Canada. According to Library and Archives Canada, he arrived in 1608 to serve as interpreter of the Mi'kmaq language to the governor of Acadia.

Did you know... the refrigerated truck was invented by Frederick McKinley Jones in 1940. If your refrigerator has any produce from your local grocery store, then you can credit African-American inventor Frederick McKinley Jones who designed and patented a portable air-cooling unit for trucks carrying perishable food.

Did you know... Barack Obama was the 44th President of the United States. He was also the first African-American President of the United States. Barack Obama was born on August 4, 1961 and is currently 62 years old.
