### TERRY FOX IS AN INSPIRATION

The name Terry Fox has come to symbolise **hope**, **courage** and **determination**. He was only 18 years old when he was diagnosed with bone cancer. He decided to run across Canada to raise funds for cancer research.

Even though he was in remission at the time, he wanted to increase cancer awareness. He had his right foot amputated due to cancer, yet he still ran the marathon.

Terry ran for several hours every day. After he got sick, he held a press conference to reveal that his cancer had come back and that he was no longer able to continue.

#### Facts:

- The Terry Fox Marathon of Hope raised over \$24.17 million dollars
- The total distance Terry Fox ran was 5,373 kilometers
- When the Marathon of Hope began, Terry Fox insisted that he run in shorts so his artificial leg was clearly visible despite the cold temperatures
- Terry Fox passed away on June 28, 1981

Terry Fox stated, "I've said to people before that I'm going to do my very best to make it, I'm not going to give up. But... if I don't, I wish for the Marathon of Hope to continue."

To raise awareness every year, many people run in the Marathon of Hope. Thanks to Terry, the donations are used for cancer research.

### THE TERRY FOX RUN AT CLIFFSIDE

Question: Who are you running for and why?

**Ms. Vlahovic:** My friend I used to dance and perform with as a kid got cancer, so I run for her.

Question: How would you organize a Terry Fox run?

**Ms. Vlahovic:** I would take the kids on a run around the community and show the community we're running for Terry.

Question: Who are you running for and why?

Ms. Georgiou: A family member.

Question: How would you organize a Terry Fox run?

Ms. Bacon: I would try and use as much space as we can around the school.

Did You Know: Terry Fox ran for 143 days and a total of 5,373 kilometers?

To date, the Marathon of Hope has raised over \$850 million dollars for cancer research.




