### News from the Art Room – Friends of Clinton-ARTsmart

For the past several weeks, Art Room coordinator Eduarda Sousa has been working with all of the primary classes (Grades K-3). They have participated in extension projects stemming from their experiences with the Indigenous Culture Project that took place in October. Students have been working with watercolour and pastels and have been studying line and form, and thinking about nature, and their gratitude for it. Each child in the primary classrooms has produced 3 pieces. As well, they have started doing charcoal drawing to explore form and light and shadow.

Last week the first set of juniors (Grades 4-6) started coming down to the Art Room to work with Eduarda. Students will be starting their practice with charcoal, exploring form and light and shadow, and will continue to move to other materials, such as acrylics, watercolours, and collage.

The wonderful thing about having an Art Room, and an art teacher, is that over time, children can develop techniques that evolve as they practice and develop. Eduarda has been hanging the kids' art in the display areas on the wall beside the Art Room entrance – stop by and take a look-see!
