

### **TDSB Student Health Pass**

One of the most important things we can do to slow the spread of COVID-19 in our schools, is for <u>students</u> to screen themselves daily for any symptoms of COVID-19 and also follow the circumstances in which they should stay home.

Students and families will need to screen themselves each morning.

Parents should sign their child's TDSB Student Health Pass daily before arriving at school. Their child will need to present this to their teacher each morning.

This revised Toronto Public Health screening does take into account COVID vaccine status of students (aged 12+).

This revised Toronto Public Health screening does indicate that if family members experience one or more of COVID-19 symptoms then the student should also stay home, and self isolate.

### **TDSB Student Health Pass**

Corvette students will receive a copy of the TDSB Student Health Pass and Screening Questionnaire on the first day of school.

Please go through the student health pass with your child daily, sign it and send it with your child to school.

Your child will present this signed portion to their teacher each morning before entry to school.

#### **TDSB Student Health Pass**

The most important thing families can do to help slow the spread of COVID-19, is to screen their children daily for any COVID-19 symptoms and keep them home from school if they are sick or have had close contact with anyone diagnosed with COVID-19.

Review this COVID-19 checklist daily with your child. Sign\* below each day to confirm that your child or anyone else in the household does not have any symptoms or have other exposure to COVID-19. We all have a role in keeping our schools safe and healthy.

### Virtual Learning

This year, Corvette Jr PS will be hosting four virtual classrooms, Grades ½, 3, and 5 (English) and a Grade ¼ (French Immersion).

Corvette Jr PS will be the virtual home to students across the city enrolled in the above classes! The teachers will be physically housed in Corvette teaching online classes.

We welcome all families to Corvette and invite you to join us in many different virtual family engagement opportunities as possible throughout the year.

### School Bus for Students in French Immersion



From September 9 to September 14, 2021 – only students with special education needs (excluding those in the gifted program) who travel to school on mini buses, mini vans, taxis and Wheelchair accessible vehicles will be provided with student transportation.

Starting September 15, 2021 –all other eligible students will be provided with student transportation, unless there is a significant driver shortage or other unforeseen issues related to COVID-19.

#### **Empty Seat Policy**

Once again, the TDSB's <u>Empty Seat Policy</u> (PR504) has been put on hold for the 2021-22 school year to help promote physical distancing on school busses, as well as to help the TSTG and bus operators effectively plan bus routes and seating arrangements in line with the COVID-19 health and safety precautions.

### **Uniforms**

Uniforms will not be mandatory this school year.

We will leave it up to families if they wish their children to wear the uniform, clothes that have school colours of grey and navy blue, or non-uniform wear.



### Pedestrian Safety Tip



Children under ten should be accompanied by adults or older children when crossing the street. At this age, their judgment and perceptual skills are still immature, yet they often eagerly try to cross streets on their own in order to demonstrate some independence. Learn more <a href="https://bit.ly/2ETzMO5">https://bit.ly/2ETzMO5</a>.

Teach children how to cross the street safely. Teach them to stop (before stepping onto the road), look left, right and left again, and listen for traffic before stepping out into the street. Teach children to wait until the street is clear and to keep looking until they have crossed the street. They should also look the driver in the eye before crossing.



The Toronto District School Board is coordinating the establishment of the Renaming Schools Reference Group. This volunteer group will be engaging in establishing a framework to lead the renaming of TDSB locations and schools.

Engaging in a process to rename a school is an acknowledgement of the need to reimagine the relationship between the school and the community. It considers both the historical and present-day significance of both the people and the space where the school resides.

# What will schooling look like?

We understand that families have a lot of questions about what school will look like as the 9th of September nears. This week several two to three minute videos will be shared with families about what schooling will look like for students attending the face to face learning at Corvette Jr PS.

Please watch these videos with your children as a way for them to anticipate school and begin to learn and relearn routines that will be set in place to keep all students and staff safe and healthy.

### How far apart is 2 m?

The Toronto Public Health has indicated the need to physically distance 2 meters apart from non family / non bubble members.

Staff will reinforce these ideas at school.

It is important to begin to teach students what a 2 metre distance looks like.

Spray painted dots will be all over the school yard to illustrate this distance.





 Physical distancing means keeping 2 metres apart from others

### What is a cohort?

You will hear and read the word "cohort" quite a lot this year. A cohort is simply a group of students who will remain together throughout the school day. A cohort will be lead by a teacher (and an Early Childhood Educator in JKSK or a Special Needs Assistant, where applicable).

The intent is to limit the number of people your child will meet throughout the day. Your child's class will most likely be cohorted with another class during recesses. The cohort cannot be larger than 50 students.

Students will be taught to monitor and leave spaces between each other during recess.

### Wearing a Cloth Mask

All staff and students (K-6) are expected to wear a mask or a cloth mask while inside the school (e.g., learning spaces, hallways, washrooms).

We ask you to please send your child to school with at least 2 snug fitting masks daily. One for the morning and another for the afternoon.
