### Winter Outdoor Recess



Elementary school students are kept indoors for recess and lunch times for a number of weather conditions such as heavy rain, lightning in the area, extreme winds and extreme cold. When temperature and wind chill measure -28C or lower, students are kept indoors. Recesses and lunch hour may be shortened if the temperature and wind chill reading is between -20C and -28C.

Listening to stories and reading a book are two different practices. Both are important processes for young people.


The think-aloud after reading / listening stories is also another critical process in the development of a literate person.

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





# Corvette Screening Process

# Daily Screening Before Entry to School

Staying home when you are sick is one of the most important things we can do to slow the spread of COVID-19. Toronto Public Health has strengthened its screening tool, based on provincial direction, that all students and staff are expected to do before coming to school each day.

Please review and become familiar with the <u>screening tool</u>, including the second page which provides direction on isolation measures in a variety of scenarios based on age and vaccination status.


Please complete the TDSB Health Pass or Health Screening App daily.

### The TDSB Student Health Pass

This is the updated student

students will receive this pass on
the first day of in-person school.

Please note there are Questions 1A and 1 B.

Please note that if students say "YES", they will need to stay home and self-isolate.

### MY CHILD MUST SELF-ISOLATE - FOR HOW LONG?

### Child/Student has symptoms\*\*\* of COVID-19 or has tested positive

#### If Child/Student is:

- 12 years of age and older AND fully vaccinated, OR
- 11 years or younger, regardless of vaccination status

#### Stay home & Self-isolate:

- Must self-isolate for at least 5 days from the day symptoms started and until symptoms have been improving for 24 hours (or 48 hours if nausea/vomiting/diarrhea), whichever is longer
- · Use test date if no symptoms

#### If Child/Student is:

- 12 years of age or older AND either partially vaccinated or unvaccinated,
- Immune compromised

### Stay home & Self-isolate:

- Must self-isolate for 10 days from the day their symptoms started, or longer if symptoms last longer than 10 days
- Use test date if no symptoms

### Someone in the household has symptoms\*\*\* of COVID-19 or has tested positive

#### Stay home & Self-isolate:

 The child/student must self-isolate for the duration of the household member's isolation period

#### If the household member is:

- 12 years of age or older AND fully vaccinated, OR
- 11 years or younger, regardless of vaccination status

### Stay home & Self-isolate:

- The child/student must self-isolate for at least 5 days from the day the household member's symptoms started and until their symptoms have been improving for 24 hours (or 48 hours if nausea/vomiting/diarrhea)
- Use test date if no symptoms

#### If the household member is:

- 12 years of age or older AND is not fully vaccinated, OR
- Immune compromised

#### Stay home & Self-isolate:

 The child/student must self-isolate for 10 days from the day the household member's symptoms started Child/Student has been notified as a close contact of someone with COVID-19 outside of the household, or received a COVID Alert notification

#### If Child/Student is:

Fully vaccinated AND no symptoms,

#### Do not need to self-isolate

- Monitor for symptoms for 10 days and self-isolate immediately if symptoms develop
- If leaving home, they should maintain masking, physical distancing and all other public health measures. They should NOT visit any highest risk settings or individuals who may be at higher risk of illness (e.g., seniors) for 10 days from their last exposure.

#### If Child/Student is:

- 12 years and older AND either partially vaccinated, unvacinated OR
- Immune compromised

#### Stay home & Self-isolate:

 Must self-isolate for 10 days from their last exposure

#### If Child/Student is:

11 years and under AND either partially vaccinated, unvacinated

#### Stav home & Self-isolate:

 Must self-isolate for 5 days from last exposure

All household members, including students and siblings, must self-isolate for the duration of time that the person with symptoms/COVID-19 positive person is isolating.

If the Child/Student/Household member's symptoms are improving for 24 hours AND tests negative on a PCR test OR 2 rapid antigen tests taken 24 to 48 hours apart, self-isolation ends.
