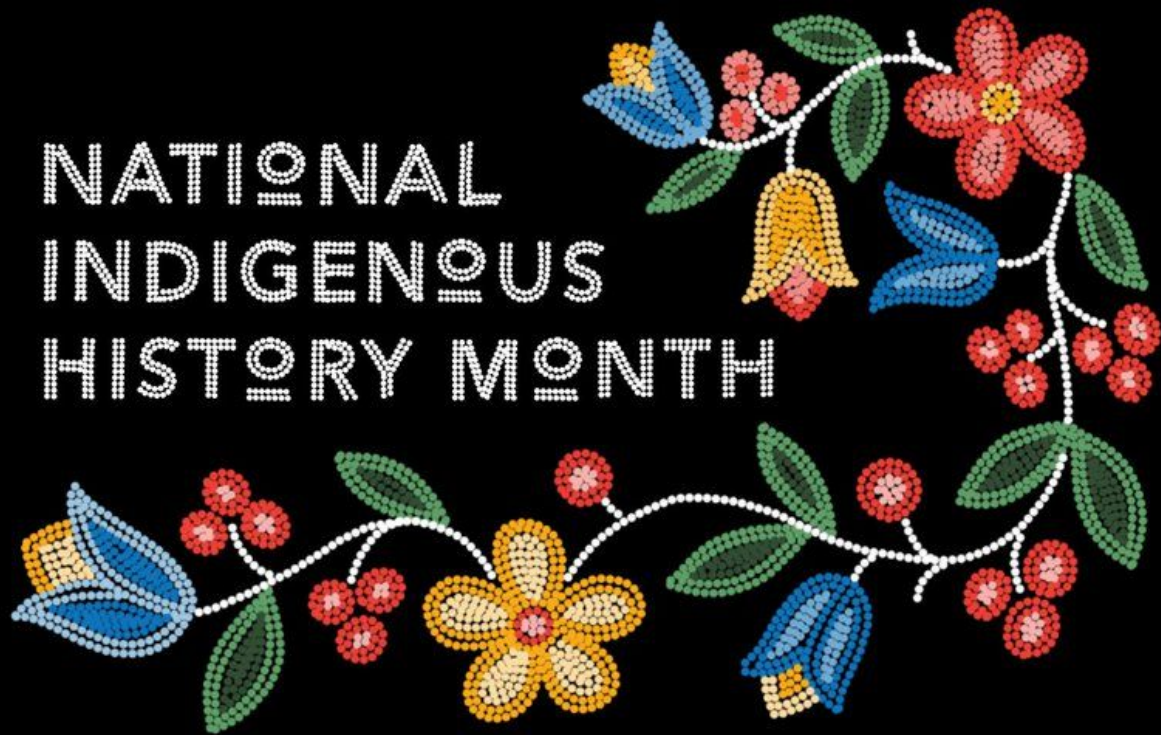
We Acknowledge

Corvette Jr PS Uniform Exchange

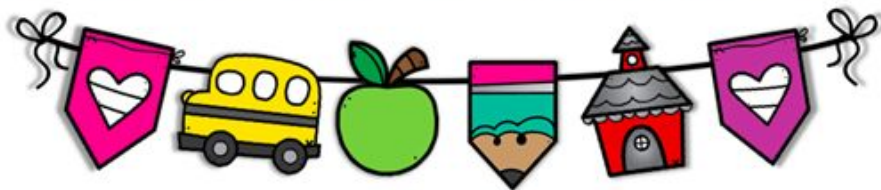
Is your child a Grade 6 student? Are you transferring to a different school next year? Do you have gently used uniforms at home?

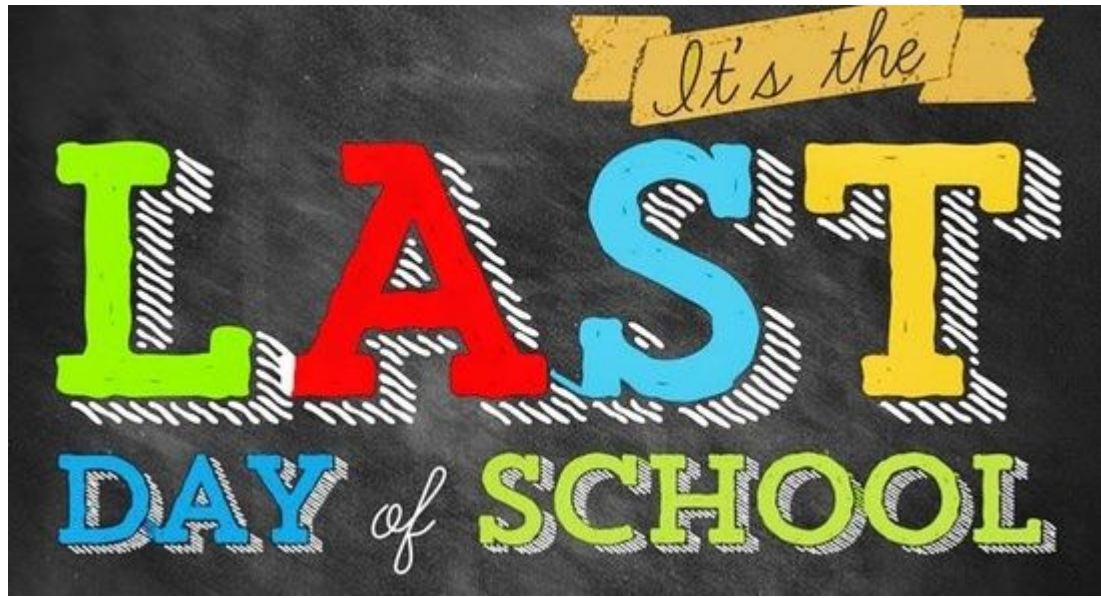

Summer Camp Extended Day Program

The Extended Day Program Summer Camp provides fun explorations and learning for children from Kindergarten to Grade 6. Children will develop skills such as collaboration, responsibility, problem-solving, creativity, citizenship, and leadership through interesting activities, experiences, and excursions. The summer program is delivered by TDSB staff, Designated Early Childhood Educators, and Early Childhood Assistants.

Extended Day Program Summer Camp is available from 7:15 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.

Campers will participate in both indoor and outdoor activities. **Two nutritious snacks will be provided but all children must bring their own lunch and refillable water bottle.**

School Improvement Planning

What are School Improvement Plans (SIP)?

A school improvement plan is a road map that sets out the changes a school needs to make to improve the level of student achievement, and shows how and when these changes will be made.

School improvement plans are selective: they help principals, teachers, and school councils answer the questions “What will we focus on now?” and “What will we leave until later?”

In the TDSB, SIPs focus on four areas:

- Equity
- Well-Being
- Achievement
- Indigenous Education

Equity and Inclusion

- How do we, as educators, continue to learn to ensure that our practices are equitable and inclusive?
 - What do we need to change in our practice so that all students can succeed and continue to work towards their full potential?
 - How can we ensure that all of our decisions center students, especially students who are in the margins?

WHAT DOES THIS LOOK LIKE?

Student Leadership

- All students should have an opportunity to practice and develop leadership skills in their classroom and throughout the school
- Classroom teachers and teacher leaders will develop opportunities for students to demonstrate leadership in different capacities
- Students will be given an opportunity to lead with teachers in different school committees

Corvette's Actions Plans for School Improvement

WHAT DOES THIS LOOK LIKE?

Let's talk (about) Math

- Understanding number facts and how number works together is crucial to **doing** the Math
- Understanding the concepts of why we do the Math in a specific manner is as crucial, if not more!
- A strong understanding of mathematical concepts gives students an opportunity to extend their thinking and apply the concepts to real life experiences

Corvette's Actions Plans for School Improvement

Small group instruction to support students' immediate needs!

WHAT DOES THIS LOOK LIKE?

- Small groups of 4 - 5 students - students grouped by student reading interest, by reading level, a reading need (e.g., need to practice endings like 'ed', 'tion', etc., specific sounds (e.g., 'oi,' 'ea,' or 'ch')
- Small groups of 4 - 5 students working on a word problem together with an adult
