One of the most important things we can do to slow the spread of COVID-19 in our schools, is for <u>students</u> to screen themselves daily for any symptoms of COVID-19 and also follow the circumstances in which they should stay home.

Students and families will need to screen themselves each morning.

Parents should sign their child's TDSB

Student Health Pass daily before arriving at school. Their child will need to present this to their teacher each morning.

Please note addition of: If the student has travelled outside of Canada in the last 14 days and was told not to attend school, then the student(s) should stay home.

This revised Toronto Public Health screening does take into account COVID vaccine status of students (aged 12+).

This revised Toronto Public Health screening does indicate that if anyone in their household is experiencing one or more of COVID-19 symptoms or are waiting for COVID test results then the student should stay home, and self isolate.

TDSB Student Health Pass

Corvette students will receive a copy of the TDSB Student Health Pass and Screening Questionnaire on the first day of school.

Please go through the student health pass with your child daily, sign it and send it with your child to school.

Your child will present this signed portion to their teacher each morning before entry to school.

TDSB Student Health Pass

The most important thing families can do to help slow the spread of COVID-19, is to screen their children daily for any COVID-19 symptoms and keep them home from school if they are sick or have had close contact with anyone diagnosed with COVID-19.

Review this COVID-19 checklist daily with your child. Sign* below each day to confirm that your child or anyone else in the household does not have any symptoms or have other exposure to COVID-19. We all have a role in keeping our schools safe and healthy.

Under this program, we offer COVID-19 saliva test kits for symptomatic staff, students, and household members, or those who have been identified by Toronto Public Health (TPH) as a high risk/close contact of a confirmed COVID-19 positive case. We also offer cohort and/or outbreak testing as recommended by TPH. Through participation in this program, we hope to provide a test that is painless and accessible, reduce COVID-19 cases iat Corvette, keep schools open, promote healthy childhood development, and support the health and safety of our community.



Which is heavier? How do you know?

Is the size of an object a good way to determine which will be heavier?

Oral communication is the first step into reasoning and proving. It is an essential building block to a literate individual.

The question, "Why?" or "How do you know?" is powerful to ignite critical thinking and reasoning.





Critical to building number sense and numeration is the deep understanding of quantity. Often we ask our youngest learners to "Count to 10!" This is a great task to remember orders of numbers.

We encourage families of young children to support numeracy by <u>learning quantities</u>.

"Can you show you me 3?"

"How many is 7? How do you know this is 7?"

"If I have 5 blocks and I put 3 more, how many do I have? How do you know?"


Occupational therapists say one of the greatest skills we can teach young students is to know the space around them. The playscape, hanging upside down, climbing and sliding, just to name a few, are a great way young children can explore space.

Tangrams is a visual representation of how a space can be filled. Can a space be filled differently? How?

As children get older we begin to use abstract measurements such as: "How far is it to the store?"

"Oh about 2 km."

Do our students know what 1 km feel like? If so, 2 km will be easier to comprehend beyond just the number "2" and the unit of measure "km."



We often hear of the importance of "peace" around the world.

We often hear the phrase "peace keeping."

The challenge of us, as a whole community, is to re-focus our teaching to "peace-making."

This involves the teaching of respect, community, service, sacrifice and togetherness.

First Nations, Inuit and Metis teachings tell us that all of us, nature, human beings and animals live in symbiosis with each other and therefore being in community is a crucial part of our existence.
