All families should have already received updates from the TDSB with regards to the Ministry of Education Learn from Home links. The TDSB has also shared learning resources. They, among others, are listed below for your reference. While we recognize that these are not replacements for in-class teaching, you and your child/children *may* wish to refer to these resources as helpful learning tools. We expect more updates and details to be communicated by the government and the TDSB as to how we can provide more robust distance education opportunities for students as social distancing moves into a more prolonged

period. What we know from the Ontario government is that schools will not re-open until at least May 4th . The TDSB is continuing to gather information, assess needs, and formulate plans about the continuation of learning and this will be communicated with schools and families as soon as these plans are finalized. I'm sure we all understand the challenges associated with such an unprecedented situation. It is important to note that these online resources are not mandatory or graded and are meant for families to use as optional resources to support independent learning while students are at home. Please do not feel guilty for not 'homeschooling' your child right now. There is not an expectation that parents fulfill this role. We know these are challenging times for students and families and the TDSB is committed to working with the Ministry of Education to support students during this unprecedented interruption to student learning.
