OFFICE HOURS

The school office is open from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday to Friday. The office is located on the first floor of the school in the centre of the building and adjacent to Durant Avenue.

We ask that parents call safe arrival if students are to be absent or late. If we do not receive a call, parents and emergency contacts will receive calls from the automated attendance monitoring system.

LEAVE THE STUDENT NAME AND THEIR HOMEROOM TEACHER'S NAME. PLEASE STATE THE REASON FOR ABSENCE AND EXPECTED RETURN DATE. ALSO, PLEASE STATE THE RELATIONSHIP OF THE PERSON MAKING THE CALL.

Parents may leave a phone message at any time during the evening, in the morning before 9:00 a.m. and in the afternoon before 1:00 p.m. Phone magnets with the school numbers are available at the office.

To ensure the safety of our students, we ask that parents use extreme caution when it is necessary for them to drive children to school. PLEASE <u>DO NOT</u> LET THEM OFF NEAR THE CROSSWALK or in the parking lot on Cosburn Avenue. We ask that when dropping off or picking up a child, you use Durant Avenue as it is zoned for this purpose. Students should be dropped off on the school (west) side of Durant. <u>PLEASE FOLLOW THE SIGNS!</u>

REGULAR ATTENDANCE AND PUNCTUALITY

- Students must attend regularly and <u>arrive in class on time, ready to learn</u>, with appropriate materials;
- Teachers must arrive in class on time; greet students at the classroom door; keep accurate records of student attendance and punctuality;
- Parents must encourage regular attendance, ensure that the students leave home in sufficient time to be punctual at school, and inform the school of the reasons for absence or lateness;
- Students should arrive at school with enough time to be able to enter the building at 8:50 a.m. Supervision begins at 8:40 a.m. On days that the Cosburn Breakfast program runs (most Monday to Fridays), breakfast begins at 8:30 am;
- Our expectation is that students arrive at school on time. Students arriving in their classroom after the specified time will be considered late and must report to the office for an admit slip. Students may be required to make up lost time.

SIGNING OUT—With Parental/Guardian WRITTEN PERMISSION

Students must have permission to sign out during the day for appointments or other reasons. Accordingly, students must bring a signed note from home with the reason in advance. Students may not sign out without permission from home.

PARENT CONCERNS

We strive to improve the level of communication between home and school. Often there are concerns that need to be communicated with Cosburn staff. We are asking parents to contact your child's teacher directly prior to involving the administration. This allows the relationship to develop with the proper stakeholders, and allows the facts to come to light. If the issue requires further attention, please contact the administration. Please refer to the TDSB Parent concern Protocol on our Website (PR 505) if you have any further questions.

LUNCHROOM GUIDELINES

Our cafeteria is available to all students eating their lunch at school. Students may either buy their lunch or bring one from home. Students have until 12:05 p.m. to eat in the cafeteria. To ensure that the lunchtime runs smoothly, the following guidelines apply. Please return the off-property permission form to grant your child permission to leave school property.

During Lunch:

- Grade 6 students are not to leave school property unless they are going home
- Grade 7 & 8 students are not to go to establishments on Coxwell Ave or inside the East York Civic Centre.

Indoor Behaviour Expectations:

- ➤ Use respectful table manners and stay seated when eating or drinking
- > Seating on a first-come basis/ ONLY use Washrooms near the Office @ lunch time
- ➤ Place trash in Green, Blue or garbage bins -- Use the correct container ©
- When purchasing food or drink: Line up in an orderly manner
- Walk in the cafeteria
- Access to lockers is at 11:28 a.m. for 5 minutes; again at 12:40 p.m. at re-entry for afternoon classes
- > Eat all food which has been purchased off school property before returning to school
- > Off-property food & garbage needs to stay off property

Outdoor Behaviour Expectations:

- > If a student chooses to go outside for lunch he/she must remain out until 12:40 p.m., weather
- > Supervisors will allow students requesting drinks and the use of the washrooms to come into the school until 12:40 p.m. – Only use the W/C by the Cosburn office—Halls are off limits
- ➤ All safety and respect guidelines apply In case of inclement weather, students will move to the Atrium

GUIDANCE AND STUDENT SERVICES



In addition to each student's homeroom teacher, a guidance counsellor is available to discuss any personal, social or academic concerns. Students may ask to speak with the guidance counsellor or be recommended by a staff member or a parent.

LOCKERS AND LOCKS



During the first days of school, students will be assigned a locker. Each student is expected to purchase a **Dudley** lock from the school or bring a combination lock, with a serial number, from home. The serial number and combination of the lock will be recorded and kept on file in the office. For security reasons students should not share the lock combination with anyone. It is each student's responsibility to maintain a neat and clean locker. Please do not write on them or hang pictures with permanent adhesive. Lockers are the property of the school and on loan to the students for the year. The school is not responsible for lost or stolen items. Any items of value should be left at home.

VISITORS TO THE SCHOOL Welcome!

Parents are asked to follow our Visitors' Protocol. All visitors to the school, parents included, are asked to sign in at the office immediately after entering the school. A visitor's pass is issued to all visitors as a means of identification. Visitors, and parents, need to return their pass and sign out when leaving. This ensures that office personnel are aware of who is in the school at all times.



COSBURN CORE VALUES: CHARACTER MATTERS!

In the winter of 2019, students, staff and parents met as part of our Caring and Safe School Committee to revise and refine our Cosburn MS Core Values. We believe that CHARACTER truly matters and presented the following statements for our school community to reflect:

Respect: Do not tolerate disrespect, not even from yourself.

Positive Attitude: Excellence is not a skill. It is a gradual result of always trying to do better.

Honesty: The truth is you always know the right thing to do. The hard part is doing it.

Responsibility: Privilege comes with great responsibility. Take charge, be responsible.



Students at Cosburn Middle School are expected to adhere to the TDSB Code of Conduct which is stated in Policy (P044). The code of conduct serves as guidelines to promote and maintain a safe and caring environment where learning is paramount.

General Expectations:

- 1. Demonstrate respectful behaviour
- 2. Pursuit of excellence in all academic and school-related endeavors
- 3. Adhering to TDSB on-line Code of Conduct
- 4. Ensure that all <u>electronic devices</u>, such as phones, mp3s and cameras <u>are left at home or turned off</u>, stored in lockers and not used in the school building or on excursions (unless given permission)
- 5. Gum chewing is not permitted. Please put gum in the garbage containers when you come in
- 6. Baseballs, skateboards, rollerblades, scooters, bicycles or similar equipment <u>may not be used in the yard between 8:00 a.m. and 4:30 p.m.</u>

7. Student Dress:

The TDSB has adopted a new <u>Student Dress Policy</u> (P042) that applies to all schools across the Board, effective September 2019. School is both a work and learning environment. We expect all dress appropriately. Students are expected to dress in a manner that is not offensive and is respectful to our school and community values. Messages on clothing must not contain inappropriate language or messages that contravene Board or School Policy.

With approximately 660 students in our yard and halls, everyone in the building is expected to follow these guidelines in order to ensure a safe, caring and respectful learning environment. Your cooperation is expected and appreciated by all 50+ staff and other students.

TEXTBOOKS - NOTEBOOKS - LIBRARY BOOKS - SCHOOL SUPPLIES

Students will be using books and materials loaned by the school. Please ensure that they are maintained and returned in good condition. Students are expected to replace them if lost or damaged.

HOMEWORK POLICY

The Toronto District School Board believes that homework is a partnership between home and school involving parents, teachers, and students. The Board believes that homework supports the student's achievement of the provincial expectations in all subjects.

The Homework Policy of Cosburn Middle School follows the Policy of the TDSB.

We believe that homework is a useful component of the program that helps students develop the appropriate knowledge, skills, and values necessary for success. Homework may also be used to extend concepts or encourage creative expression related to in-class learning.

To be meaningful, homework must be appropriate to the age, stage of development, learning styles, interests, and needs of the student. Care is taken in the planning and assignment of homework to achieve an appropriate amount for students. It is understood that following up on homework activities is crucial to its success. If a student is not bringing work home on a **regular** basis or is not completing work on time, parents, students and teachers have the responsibility to communicate with each other and establish a plan for improvement.

Appropriate amount of homework for Grades 6, 7 and 8 is <u>45 - 90 minutes</u> five times per week, and although the teacher may not assign homework every day, we believe in the "3Rs". If no homework has been assigned on a particular day, all students should spend half an hour to an hour "Reading, Reviewing, or Re-writing." Completion of homework indicates a positive and responsible attitude, which is noted on each student's report card.

It is the responsibility of teachers..."to coordinate activities, as appropriate, by division, grade, or subject in order that balanced amounts of relevant homework are assigned."

STUDENT ASSESSMENT AND EVALUATION

Assessment is the process of gathering information that accurately reflects how well a student is achieving the curriculum expectations in a subject or course. The primary purpose of assessment is to improve student learning.

Teachers will obtain assessment information through a variety of means, which may include formal and informal observations, discussions, learning conversations, questioning, conferences, homework, tasks done in groups, demonstrations, projects, portfolios, developmental continua, performances, peer and self-assessments, self-reflections, essays, and tests.

Students must understand that the tests/exams they complete and the assignments they submit for evaluation must be their own work and that cheating and plagiarism will not be condoned.

Parents should contact their child's teacher(s) if there are any difficulties with an assessment or evaluation. A progress report is sent home in November. This report grants parents a snapshot of how students are progressing with their transition to the new school year. There are no marks on this report. Report cards will be sent home at the end of first term and at the end of the school year. The dates are published in the school calendar and you will receive the calendar within the first week of school. Parent-teacher interviews will be scheduled on the evening prior to P.A. Days and on the P.A. Day itself. Please see the school calendar for details and dates for the year.

At other times during the year, parent-teacher interviews will be scheduled to discuss a student's progress. We encourage our teachers to be in contact with parents on an on-going basis. If parents wish to contact teachers or the school office to discuss a student's progress, they should telephone the school at (416) 396-2335 during school hours.

COSBURN SCHOOL COUNCIL

The Cosburn School Council is a volunteer organization who's job is to discuss issues related to how the school functions and how parents and the school can work together to improve school achievement. It plays an advisory role to the Principal and Vice-Principal, the school board and government agencies on behalf of all the parents and others in the school community. The Council typically meets five times a school year (about every two months) with extra meetings if the need arises.

Every parent of a student enrolled in the school is eligible to become a Council member. Elected members participate in the running of the Council. Nomination Process and election details are sent home with the students in September of each year. Membership on a school council benefits the school and the individuals involved.

The advantages of being on school council include:

- being an important partner in the education system, one whose views are valued;
- contributing to the shared goal of improving student achievement;
- having a vehicle through which to express opinions; and
- being able to keep informed about what is happening at the school, the board, and at the provincial level of education

Participating on the Cosburn School Council is a rewarding experience for all those who value the opportunity to make a difference in their children's education. All Council meetings are public and are announced through the School's website. If you are interested in getting regular email updates on School Council please let one of the co-chairs know. The Library is a welcoming space that is open to all students. Students are encouraged to visit during school hours, before school, at lunch and after school. During most weeks, **library hours are**:

Monday-Thursday: 8:30-8:50 AM LUNCH: 12:10-12:40PM 3:18-4:00 PM

Students are to wait at the doors closest to the Library and the Librarian will pick them up at the designated times. Book borrowing periods are two weeks long and students are encouraged to sign out English and French books frequently and consistently. Reading is thinking! EMERGENCY PROCEDURES

We will conduct <u>Fire Drills and Lockdown Drills</u> in accordance with the policies of the TDSB, throughout the year. The evacuation routes and the alternatives are posted in each room and special instructions will be given by the staff if required.

In a fire drill **everyone** leaves the building. If students, staff or visitors are in the school, be it between classes, at the office or in the washroom, they **must** leave the building immediately.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION CLOTHING

Physical Education is an integral part of the school program. We expect all students to participate actively in the regular program and we encourage participation in our Intramural program and co-curricular sports. The standard clothing for gym classes consists of a tee shirt, shorts, socks and running shoes. Students will be asked to purchase Cosburn Middle School gym clothing; it will be on sale through homeroom teachers in September.

COSBURN ATHLETIC CODE

Here at Cosburn, we work extremely hard to furnish every student with the opportunity to experience and define success in their own terms. The whole school experience encompasses more than just the classroom experience. Athletics support healthy and active lifestyles which are instrumental in child development. They provide an opportunity to practice and model commitment, fairness, honesty, determination, perseverance, and respect. For these reasons, we have developed the Cosburn Athletic Code. Thank you to all students, parents, and staff that contributed to the creation of our Code!

Cosburn Athletic Code

- Participation in Inter-school sports is a privilege and not a guarantee
- Student Athletes are expected to perform in the classroom. All work is to be completed, and behaviour is respectful at all times
- Student Athletes need to assume all of the responsibilities of being committed to a team
- As a member of a team, Student Athletes are expected to attend all practices
- Student Athletes must demonstrate a positive and respectful attitude to their coaches/staff, teammates, opponents, and most importantly any referees and/or officials
- Student Athletes are Ambassadors of Cosburn, and their behaviour in and out of school should reflect positivity and sportsmanship
- If a student is unable to make a practice or game, they need to inform their coach in advance when possible
- Student Athletes are expected to inform all of their teachers prior to a competition that occurs during the school day to obtain assigned work
- Student Athletes that resign without good reason, or are dismissed from a team will not participate in other school athletic events for the next athletic season of the school year
- Student Athletes are expected to come to practices and games on time, prepared for participation
- Student Athletes must respect and support their teammates on and off the playing field
- Coaches will post lists as tryouts occur
- Coaches will submit schedules, tryout forms, and permission forms to parents in a timely manner
- Coaches will discuss their expectations with their athletes on a consistent and continuous basis
- Winning at the cost of sportsmanship, ethical behaviour, and commitment is not an option
- Coaches will have the final say when it comes to their rosters and strategic approach to games as they have spent the time training their athletes
- Coaches will try their best to engage all athletes on their roster during competition.
- Parents are asked to respect the decisions of the coaches as they are volunteering their time to provide the extra-curricular activity
- As is recommended in many sports leagues with volunteer coaches, in an attempt to ensure that cooler heads will always prevail, we agree that Cosburn athletes, parents and/or spectators do not approach our coaches to discuss concerns about a game or a game incident until at least 24 hours after the fact.

COSBURN INTRAMURAL HOUSE LEAGUE PROGRAM
