Lunch Reminders

Lunch at Cosburn is from 11:28 to 12:40. Once students are dismissed from class, they head to their lockers, collect what they will need over lunch and then proceed to the cafeteria or if they have written permission, go home or off property. Grade 7 and 8 students who do have parental permission to leave school property are reminded to be on their best behaviour. Students are not to be visiting restaurants along Coxwell Avenue or the Civic Centre cafeteria during lunch. They should not go further west than Dieppe Park.

Once students have finished eating lunch, they head outside to the field. Please note the front of the school is not supervised during lunch.

As we do have several students with life-threatening allergies, Cosburn is a nut-free school. Please ensure no nut or peanut-containing food is sent to school.

Reminders from The Office

A reminder to parents/caregivers that items that are left in the office for a student must be clearly marked with a name. Students are to take the responsibility of coming to the office to pick up their belongings. We will not be disturbing classes to call students down to the office.

Safe arrival calls should be made to (416) 396-2339 by 9 am (messages can be left any time before 9 am)

Parents are reminded when leaving messages re: absences to <u>slowly and clearly spell</u> the students name and indicate their class and/or teacher name.

Bike Safety

Many of our students continue to be active in many outdoor activities like bike riding. The Toronto District School Board and Toronto Public Health want kids to be safe while playing outdoors. Parents and caregivers can "stay a step ahead" by protecting children when they ride. Here's how:

- 1.An adult should always supervise children 10 years of age or younger when they are using a bicycle or other wheeled sports equipment. Even older children may need on-going supervision when riding near the road.
- 2. Make sure children wear the correct helmet properly when they ride. Ontario's bike helmet law requires all children and youth under age 18 to wear an approved bike helmet when riding a bicycle.
- 3. Keep children away from traffic when they use wheeled sports equipment. Make sure they ride in a safe place.
- 4. Teach children how to:
 - a. steer, brake and ride in a straight line
 - b. wear the right safety gear, and
- c. do a safety check every time they ride a bicycle, scooter, skateboard, use in-line skates or wear shoes with wheels.
- 5. Always walk a bicycle, scooter or skateboard across a street intersection, instead of riding across. This includes crosswalks.
- 6. Tell children that you are happy when you see them riding safely.
- 7. Remind children of the safety rules.
- 8. Be a good role model wear a helmet and safety gear yourself. Children copy what adults do.
- 10. Remind children that bikes, scooters and skateboards are not to be used on Cosburn School property between 8 am and 4 pm. This is to keep all students safe.

This, of course, is the ultimate goal. Amazingly, both of our Grade 6 teams placed first, with many of our runners coming in the top 20. Honorable mentions go out to Hughie Graham in first place and Josh Kane, close behind in second. Racquel DeCoste Sanchez also came in second place along with several other girls in the top 10. - Forms are distributed week of Jan. 11th, once the TDSB publishes the status for Optional Attendance for each school, Open, Limited or Closed
- Forms are distributed week of Jan. 9th (maximum of two choices per student)
- Parents/guardians must deliver forms to selected schools no later than 4pm Feb.3/17
- High Schools render decisions by Friday, February 17/2017

Final Choices for 9 and Course Selection Form

- Students who have been accepted by Specialized schools/programs, must adhere to those respective timelines and application requirements
- For students who don't intend to apply to Optional Attendance or Specialized Schools/Programs, final Course Selection Forms must be completed online using MyBlueprint.ca and paper copy by *Friday*, *February 24/2017*
- Students waiting for Optional Attendance or Specialized Schools/Programs decisions, must complete paper copy only, by *Friday*, *February* 24/2017
- Final Course Selection Forms delivered by Guidance to respective schools no later than *Friday*, *March* 3/2017

Students will be receiving a copy of the "Choices for 9" guide soon. Please take the opportunity to review the information provided. Now is a good time to ensure that students and parents have either created or updated the MyBlueprint account needed to guide students' transition plans.
