Toronto Public Health will be doing their annual dental screenings starting on January 26th, and will be done over several days. The school screening programs do not replace a dental examination that is done at a dentist's office. The screening can provide an early sign of possible problems that should be looked at more closely.

Grade 7 & 8 Students - Life, Education and Career Planning using MyBlueprint

Grade 7&8 students at Cosburn MS have participated in the MyBlueprint workshop to either create an account or continue in to developing their Individual Pathways Plan (IPP) as mandated by the Ministry of Education. The link is <u>www.myblueprint.ca/tdsb</u>. Students should be working towards 100% completion of their IPP by the end of the school year. Mr. Daniele has facilitated the use of the web-based tool and many students are well on their way completing Goal Setting exercises, Learning Style assessments and reflections accordingly.

Parents/Guardians are encouraged to sit down with their Grade 7/8 child so that they may create a "Parent" account that will allow them to link with their child's IPP.

This is a useful tool in helping students and parents to plan for decisions around high school and post-

- (a) Consult the Optional Attendance status of high schools (deemed either Open, Limited or Closed); TDSB publishes report first week of January
- (b) Students may apply to a maximum of 2
 Optional Attendance schools deemed either Open or Limited
- (c) Forms will be provided by Mr. Daniele
- (d) Once completed, forms must be delivered to the respective high school(s) by parent/guardian no later than 4pm Feb. 3, 2017
- (e) High schools will render decisions of the lottery on or before Feb. 17/2017

Grade 7 Boys Basketball Team:






