Theatre Direct at Crescent Town

The Kindergarten and Grade 1 classes have been enjoying drama workshops and performances from Theatre Direct, an organization that focuses on Theatre experiences for young people. An actor came to visit each class for one week. Each student got a change to share a story with the actor and have the story dramatized in class. The actor reads the story and students got to play the different parts to make the story come to life. Children were able to use their imaginations to express their stories and make characters meaningful. The learning about the elements of a story: plot (beginning, middle and end), characters (who is in the story) and setting (where the story takes place. Students also enjoyed drama activities led by the actors, such as moving their bodies from low to high while also sounding out letter sounds in a low to high tone. On the last week of January, the actors presented a play called Lost and Found, where they used items such as scarves, mittens and umbrellas to make puppets in their show. The students very much enjoyed the play and showed their enthusiasm with a lot of laughs and applause at the end. The Crescent Town teachers were proud to see students being respectful audience members.

Chinese-Canadians will recognize the Lunar New Year starting on January 28 and will continue with celebrations throughout the month of February.

February is Kindergarten Registration Month

Kindergarten is the first step in a lifelong journey that will see your child learn, grow, and succeed at the Toronto District School Board. At the TDSB, we know early learners learn best through doing; so our four and five year olds are introduced to math and science through play as part of k-12 STEM programming. To attend Junior Kindergarten in September, children must turn four-years-old by December 31. To register for Senior Kindergarten, children must be five-years-old by December 31.
