Our first month of the school year has concluded and so much has taken place both inside and outside the classrooms of Crescent Town during this eventful and exciting time of year. Our Kindergarten students have adjusted well to their school routines and expectations while Grade 1s continue to explore new spaces for learning in the school. We want to thank you parents for your continued support as our partners in education and a positive home and school partnership.

We are delighted to announce the great achievement of our Grade 3 students (2015/2016) in EQAO testing which sets us above both Board and Provincial standards. With scores of 85% in Reading, 91% in Writing and 85% in Math, there is a great deal for all of us to be proud of. This represents our bright young students, hard-working teachers and a highly supportive parent community. This achievement is something for the entire school and community to take a great deal of pride in.

September 30th marked Orange Shirt Day across the country and TDSB schools. This is an important day to reflect on the impact of Residential Schooling on First Nations communities in Canada. On this day, each student received a button "Every Child Matters" to commemorate the occasion and teachers took time in classrooms to discuss this issue further. This day also marked our first Character Assembly of the year and we'd like to acknowledge Mrs. Sirizzotti's class for a most memorable performance paying tribute to Residential School survivors. We also want to congratulate all students that were recognized for demonstrating Respect at the assembly. Our Character Trait focus for October is Responsibility.

As many of you have observed, there is a great deal of construction in progress at Crescent Town to improve our play options for students as well as making the school more accessible for all. We are pleased to see the completion of the new walkway at the front of the building. Our Kindergarten Play area should be completed in the next month approximately and we look forward to classes being able to use the new playground. We thank parents for their patience during this team. We want to assure parents/guardians that all such work to the site is for improving conditions for our students and setting them for a safe and successful learning experience.

Finally, we'd like to remind everyone that students should be brining litter less lunches to school to reduce waste be environmentally responsible as an ECO school. We continue to address this issue with students at school and thank you parents for doing your part in discussing this at home with your children. October will no doubt be filled with many events and highlights and we look forward to touching base with you in the next newsletter.
