





Yonge Street Tragedy Commemoration Colouring Sheet and Ceremony (April 23)

Councillor Filion is passing along a colouring sheet developed by the Yonge Street Tragedy Commemoration Committee.

Info on the Artist: The artist is Lisa Rotenberg, who had a home in Willowdale at the time of the Tragedy in 2018. Lisa Rotenberg is also listed with the Art Gallery of Canada. Her website: <u>http://www.lisarotenberg.com/</u>

Lisa created this colouring sheet to help teachers facilitate conversations with students about how a community responds to tragedy through acts of heroism, courage, and kindness. She is also adamant that such conversations about the Yonge Street Tragedy in particular can help to end violence against women, which was a primary motivation for the horrible attack down Yonge Street on April 23, 2018 by "John Doe".

Plaques remembering the Yonge Street Tragedy are installed at Olive Square Park and Mel Lastman Square. The language was developed by residents who continue to coordinate the annual commemorations:

"Yonge Street Tragedy

"A horrific tragedy struck Yonge Street between Finch and Sheppard Ave on April 23, 2018. Ten of our own family members, friends, neighbours and colleagues lost their lives, and another 16 were injured. The pain this attack caused will be slow to heal, but the response of love in the midst of tragedy will always be remembered. Our cries of sorrow are slowly being turned into songs of healing."



The plan is to deliver the award materials to your school on the week of June 6, 2021 for distribution by the school administration.

Please nominate a student as soon as possible, so that the Councillor's Office can prepare these materials. We cannot accept names after June 1st.

It is very helpful for us to know two pieces of information for your student:

A) Student Name

B) Details about why that student deserves the award. Please consider including:

- School group/committee and/or neighbourhood group/committee the student participated in

- Student's activity that warrants the award

- Who nominated the student (principal or teacher or staff)

Bike Racks for Willowdale Schools & Bike-Themed Community Events

Eight schools in Willowdale have requested bike racks to be installed through the "Bike Racks for Willowdale Schools" program, in partnership with Trustee Rizzo (TCDSB) and Trustee Brown (TDSB). There are 20-24 bike racks requested, which will yield between 360 – 432 new bike lock locations in local schools. Nicole Hausman (cc'ed on this message), from the Councillor's office, has been the primary contact over the course of the last several months.

Participating TCDSB Schools:

St. Edward Catholic School: 3 bike racks requested

Brebeuf College School: 4 bike racks requested

St. Cyril Catholic School: 2 bike racks requested

Participating TDSB Schools:

Churchill Public School: 2-3 bike racks requested

Cummer Valley Middle School: 2-3 bike racks requested

Finch Public School: 3-4 bike racks requested

Earl Haig Collegiate Institute: 2-3 bike racks requested

Willowdale Middle School: 2 bike racks requested

Bike-themed events:

As a condition for the program, each school needed to commit to doing a bike-themed event. The Parent/School Council was responsible for leading these events. The Councillor has appointed me to help support and, if needed, to coordinate his engagement with these events.

The suggestion is that these events take place in or near the "Bike to School Week" from May 30-June 3, 2022.
