Character Trait of the Month

March - Honesty | Honnêteté

Your child can show honesty by:

- · sharing his or her feelings and being truthful
- · telling the truth, even though he or she may know that there will be consequences
- · being reliable and responsible in completing a job

Questions to discuss with your child:

- What does it mean to be honest? Discuss different ways to be honest with yourself, with your peers, and with others.
- · What should you do if you need to tell the truth, but you know there will be consequences?
- How do you feel when someone else has been dishonest with you? What would you do?
- Once trust has been broken, what can you do to get it back? Have you ever lost someone's trust? Has someone lost your trust?
- What's the difference between being honest with your own family and being honest with someone you've just met?

Projects to do together:

- Watch TV shows or movies. Talk about the ways in which the characters were honest or dishonest with each other.
- Read the story entitled The Boy Who Cried Wolf, and discuss the importance of being honest.

Encouraging honesty in your child:

- Give your child opportunities to tell the truth.
- Make sure that you explain to your child that you always want the truth, even though he or she may be afraid that you might be angry.
- Encourage and praise your child when he or she is honest.
- · Model honesty by returning lost items.

April – Co-operation | La coopération

Your child can show co-operation by:

- · playing and working peacefully with others in the family
- · listening to adults and being respectful of their requests
- · working with others to complete a task and/or achieve a goal
- · helping to find a compromise when there are family disagreements

Questions to discuss with your child:

- What is co-operation, and what does it mean to be co-operative in a family?
- · What are some things you do at home or at school that require co-operation?

Projects to do together:

- Make a list of things that your family does that require co-operation.
- Watch for situations on television that demonstrate co-operative behaviour, and talk about the various ways in which the characters acted co-operatively with each other.
- Work together on chores at a time when all members of the family can work together to finish them.
- Complete a fun project that involves all family members (e.g., putting together a jigsaw puzzle, making a homemade pizza).

Encouraging co-operation in your child:

- Praise your child when he or she is co-operative.
- Help your child become aware of his or her own co-operative or unco-operative behaviour.
- Share your own experiences of co-operative/unco-operative behaviour and how it affected a
 goal.

World Water Day - The Great Gulp WWF Earth Hour



Students in Eco Club and across the school engaged in learning about the importance of water and celebrated World Water Day on March 22nd with The Great Gulp. We all took a sip of water at the same time from a reusable bottle or cup and engaged in conversations about the importance of water conservation and the need to protect it. Water is life!

So many wonderful books are being used to help learn about the importance of protecting water and especially making an emphasis to include different perspectives and voices such as those who are affected the most negatively by water.







We also participated in WWF Earth Hour on the same afternoon to take action for climate change. Many classes were able to keep the learning going with lights and technology off for the last hour of the school day. Mme Pabani and Ms. Alexander taught two Kindergarten classes about water pollution. Mrs. Chung used this time as an opportunity to sing and build community in her music class with Mrs. Mehta's students. Many classes worked on writing their Earth Hour pledges for 1 action they can take to change their habits and others outside!

Mme Pabani and Mme Veneat's class observed World Water Day by learning how their actions can impact the world water supply. Led by Ms. A., students added different items to the clean water of their sponge fish. Each item represented a real threat to our water ways such as pollution and climate change. After adding all items, students could see that the water was no longer a healthy habitat for the fish.

As a group, students came up with ideas on how they could help ensure our water stays clean such as disposing of chemicals in the proper way, recycling, and using reusable water bottles.



Eco Water Tip: Turn off the water when brushing your teeth, when washing the dishes, and take shorter showers and baths.

Eco Energy Tip: Lights off when you leave a room and unplug unnecessary cords and appliances. Reduce your <u>phantom</u> power!

On Tuesday, March 26, 2024, room 201 went to the Ontario Science Centre to learn


