We did our Graduation photos at the end of March and look forward to celebrating our Grade 5 leaders as they slowly close this portion of their elementary learning journey.


As we navigate the continuously changing weather, please remind your children to dress in layers, and wear appropriate foot ware so that they remain comfortable, warm, and dry when they play outside.

This month our staff started their Professional Development on Mindfulness, Mental Wellness and Self Care.

What is mindfulness?

Mindfulness is the basic human ability to be fully present, aware of where we are and what we're doing, and not overly reactive or overwhelmed by what's going on around us.

While mindfulness is something we all naturally possess, it's more readily available to us when we practice on a daily basis.

Whenever you bring awareness to what you're directly experiencing via your senses, or to your state of mind via your thoughts and emotions, you're being mindful. And there's growing research showing that when you train your brain to be mindful, you're remodeling the physical structure of your brain.

The goal of mindfulness is to wake up to the inner workings of our mental, emotional, and physical processes.
