Answer: The school has an active response with teacher monitors that are in contact with each other via Walkie-Talkie. They will approach individuals if their access to the property is inappropriate. If escalation is required, the Principal or the Vice Principal will be called to address the situation, if further escalation is required, Toronto Police Services will be called.

Question: Are there extra-curricular labs available for students?

Question: There was a scientist in the school, and has visiting some classes not others, will all classes be able to benefit from this event?

Answer: There wasn't enough coverage to keep the event open later. The event will close tomorrow and Mr. E invited parents to come in the morning if they have availability.

Answer: There is a plumbing issue in the building and the school is working to address it as soon as possible.
