Traffic Safety Tips: Help Make this a Safe Winter Season

As winter approaches, we know that severe weather will be part of our daily lives for the next several months. While traffic safety is an important matter all year long, this is a particularly good time to review what we can do to keep students safe.

The need to be aware and alert at all times, on any road, and even in the most routine circumstances is key to traffic safety. This applies to students and drivers alike. Road conditions can be challenging in the winter months. So to those of us who drive, please take extra care on the roads and in parking lots, especially in areas where children might be present.

School staff periodically review street and traffic safety with students. Parents can help reinforce these safety messages with children at home. Below are some tips that might be helpful to review.

- Stop, look, and listen for traffic.
- Only cross at corners and crosswalks.
- Make eye contact with drivers.
- Walk on the right side of the crosswalk.
- Wear appropriate footwear to reduce the chances of slipping.
- Never run into the street.
- Obey crossing signals.
- Cross only if clear.
- Walk on sidewalks.
- Where there are no sidewalks, walk as far away from traffic as possible, facing traffic.

The safety of our students is always a top priority. Let's work together to make the winter season safe so we can enjoy all it has to offer

OPTIONAL ATTENDANCE DEADLINE

Students who reside within the City of Toronto have the right to attend a school which is designated to serve their residential address.

Students also have the opportunity to access schools outside of the school that is designated to serve their residential address by applying on optional attendance. Acceptance at these schools is subject to space availability and program suitability.

Each year in December, schools are classified as **limited** or **closed** to optional attendance based on the space they have available for the upcoming school year.

A school classified as **limited** can accept students on optional attendance. A limited school is not obliged to accept all students who apply on optional attendance. Acceptance is conditional upon space being available in the appropriate grade and program.

A school classified as **closed** cannot accept any students on optional attendance. Only students residing within the school's attendance area will be accepted.

If a school is classified as limited, and you are interested in applying to that school, please contact the school's principal.

To apply for optional attendance, you must pick up an optional attendance form from the home school and complete it and return it to the applied school NO LATER THAN FRIDAY FEBRUARY 11, 2022.

Rapid Antigen Test Kits for Student Use over Winter Break

As per the Ministry of Education's announcement last week, each student will be provided with rapid antigen tests to take home for use over the winter break. This will support families to be safe over the holidays and limit exposure if any covid symptoms appear. We are still awaiting further directive from the ministry, but we anticipate that this will arrive in the next week or two. Please be sure to read over all the information and instructions carefully when they are sent home.

Saliva Test Kits

If your child develops ANY symptoms of COVID-19, it is highly recommended that they complete a saliva test. We have test kits at the school that you can pick up. It is a simple, pain free test to ensure that everyone in your family and our community remain safe. Sick Kids picks up the completed tests each morning around 9:15 a.m. and results are available online within 48 hours.

Please do not hesitate to reach out to the school if you require a kit. A student or family member with 1 symptom needs to be tested to ensure the safety of everyone. Thank you for your cooperation.
