Davisville Replacement School – Construction Summary Update 43 Millwood, Toronto, ON Report Number. 06

Please note that the Toronto District School Board (TDSB) follows-up on the project on a daily basis, conducts periodic site visits and mantains regular communications with consultants (including third-party inspection consultants).

PROGRESS OF THE WORK:

- Construction continues as per schedule (substantial completion date April 2021).
 The building substructure and superstructure are in progress. A more detailed breakdown of the different construction phases will be developed as the building shell is completed.
- Initial shoring & excavation scope is complete. Second phase along eastern edge
 of the site has started trees have been cleared along the easterly fence line in
 preparation for shoring & excavation for the below-grade parking access ramp.
 Please note that this is outside the main building footprint, but will be part of the ongoing construction and site development for the duration of the project.
- Construction vehicle access continues to be managed and monitored. The
 contractor continues to be aware of neighbourhood concerns and will ensure
 cleanliness. Provisions include a dedicated sweeper and washing down trucks
 before they leave the site. Note that a full height protective filter cloth has been
 installed along the hoarding fence to mitigate dust migration.
- Footings for the school building north of the parking structure are being completed. Waterproofing of the below-grade parking structure continues. The elevator sump pit and other elements of the main circulation core are in progress.
- Construction of the first floor bearing walls and building steel framing for the superstructure continues – gymnasium framing is being erected. Concrete belowgrade parking shell has been built up to grid 16. Additional grids to line 18 outside the main building footprint - defining the parking access ramp enclosure and driveway – will be built once shoring & excavation noted above is complete.
- Stockpiled material on-site has either been removed or is being managed to reduce dust and other negative impact on the neighbourhood.
