
Sports News

Families donate new or gently used items (even "re-gifts" what you have never used!). Gift-wrap, bags, and ribbon are also welcome! Each Denlow class goes "shopping" and buys these items (most items are priced between \$0.50-\$5.00) to give to family members during the holidays.



Kids and Flu – From Toronto Public Health

The flu germs spread when people cough, sneeze or talk. The flu germs can also live on surfaces like toys, countertops, and door handles for up to eight hours. Students can pass the flu germs to each other, to school staff and to family members before they show symptoms. Children under five, seniors and people in poor health are at greater risk of complications from flu. Vaccination is the best protection against flu. Influenza vaccines are free in Ontario. They are safe. The vaccine helps a child's immune system prevent flu but cannot give them the flu. The vaccine is available at doctor's offices, health clinics, and at Toronto Public Health clinics. It takes 2 weeks for the vaccine to be fully effective. toronto.ca/health/flu

Tips on staying healthy this flu season:

- 1. Get your flu shot early
- 2. Wash your hands often
- 3. Avoid touching face and eyes
- 4. Cover your cough or sneeze
- 5. Do not share drinking cups and utensils
- Disinfect common surfaces like door handles, hand railings, keyboards, cell phones and tablets.

From the Denlow Me to We Club



Dear Denlow Parents and Guardians,

As the holiday season draws near, we are reminded of just how lucky we are to live in this wonderful city and country. We have a lot to be grateful for, but not everyone in Toronto is so lucky.

Did you know ...?

- Toronto continues to be the child poverty capital of Canada
- 133,000* Toronto children live in poverty
- One-third* of Toronto families are living in housing that is either unaffordable, overcrowded, or in poor state of repair
- Food bank usage has increased by almost 50%* in Toronto's inner suburbs over the past decade

These facts may leave you with a heavy heart, but there are things that we can do to help. In 1991, Mrs. Pat Wolfson, a Denlow teacher who has since retired, founded the campaign, "A Kid Like Me" with her class. This campaign is a <u>toy</u> <u>drive</u> which encourages Denlow students to do various extra jobs at home in order to raise money to purchase gifts for other children, who, although not as privileged, are "just like them".

Over the years, "A Kid Like Me" has become an important tradition at Denlow. It has provided Denlow students an opportunity to demonstrate empathy, responsibility and leadership. After Mrs. Wolfson retired, her daughter, Elyssa, who was also a teacher at Denlow, took over the campaign. Mrs. Wolfson still regularly works as a supply teacher at Denlow. Last year, she attended our Me to We Club meeting and shared the story of "A Kid Like Me". 2019 marks the second year that Denlow's Me to We Club has run the "A Kid Like Me" campaign.

We would appreciate very much if your child could:

- Do various age appropriate jobs around the home to earn money
- With the money earned, buy a new gift that a 'kid like them' would enjoy (4-13 year olds)
- Place the <u>UNWRAPPED</u> gift into a gift bag (or plastic bag if a gift bag is unavailable)
- Bring the gift to school starting next week and up until our final collection day of <u>December 13th</u>. Please drop gifts off at the office or Ms. Di Cesare or Mme Connors' classroom.

Me to We Club members will visit each classroom next week to spread awareness via a short presentation.

Once again, all gifts will be donated to a school in east Toronto. In recent years, Denlow has provided close to 400 students with gifts for the holiday season. Our goal is to average one gift for every Denlow student. We sincerely hope you will join us in participating in Denlow's very own annual sharing and giving event.
