Students are invited to wear costumes to school on the 31st. A reminder that weapons as part of the costume will not be allowed and will be kept in the office during the day. Wearing masks is not advised especially due to safety on stairs.

Hallowe'en Safety

Hallowe'en is also a time for us to take extra care to ensure safety. Here are some trick-ortreat safety rules:

- Young children should ALWAYS be accompanied by an older person.
- Children should NEVER eat any treats until parents have had a chance to go through them and inspect them. Parents should look for tampering of packages and discard any they believe to be unsafe.
- Remind children that not everyone celebrates Hallowe'en and to avoid any homes that have no lights on. Also remind children not to run through neighbours' yards or gardens.
- If adults are driving anywhere on Hallowe'en night, drive slowly with lights on and be cautious when pulling to the side of the road. Keep a close watch in residential areas for children crossing the road (especially between parked cars)
- Be seen! Have your child carry a flashlight and wear light or reflective clothing. Make up or face paint is preferable to a mask as your child's vision is not obstructed.
- Children should wear their own shoes when trick or treating. Wearing costume shoes can be dangerous and uncomfortable.
- If parents cannot accompany an older child, then know the route your child will take.
- Remind children of road safety rules. Cross only at corners. Do not criss-cross the road. Go up one side of the road and down the other side. Never cross between parked cars.

Kids and Flu - From Toronto Public Health

The flu germs spread when people cough, sneeze or talk. The flu germs can also live on surfaces like toys, countertops, and door handles for up to eight hours. Students can pass the flu germs to each other, to school staff and to family members before they show symptoms. Children under five, seniors and people in poor health are at greater risk of complications from flu. Vaccination is the best protection against flu. Influenza vaccines are free in Ontario. They are The vaccine helps a child's immune safe. system prevent flu but cannot give them the flu. The vaccine is available at doctor's offices. health clinics, and at Toronto Public Health clinics. It takes 2 weeks for the vaccine to be fully effective. toronto.ca/health/flu

Tips on staying healthy this flu season:

- 1. Get your flu shot early
- 2. Wash your hands often
- 3. Avoid touching face and eyes
- 4. Cover your cough or sneeze
- 5. Do not share drinking cups and utensils
- 6. Disinfect common surfaces like door handles, hand railings, keyboards, cell phones and tablets.
