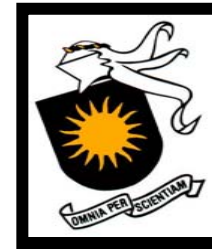



Personal Electronic Device Policy

- ⌘ The school is not responsible for lost or stolen items.

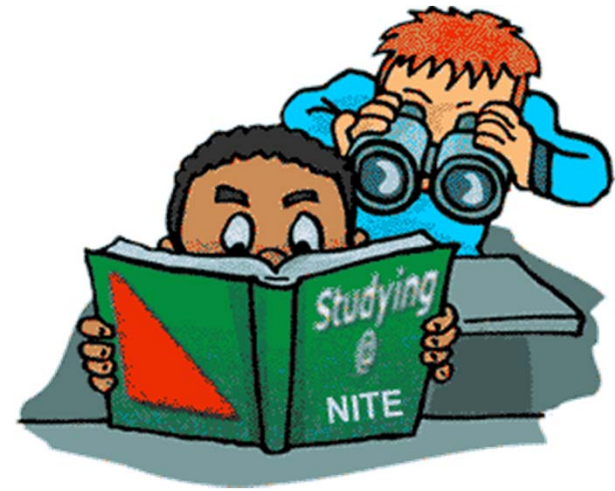
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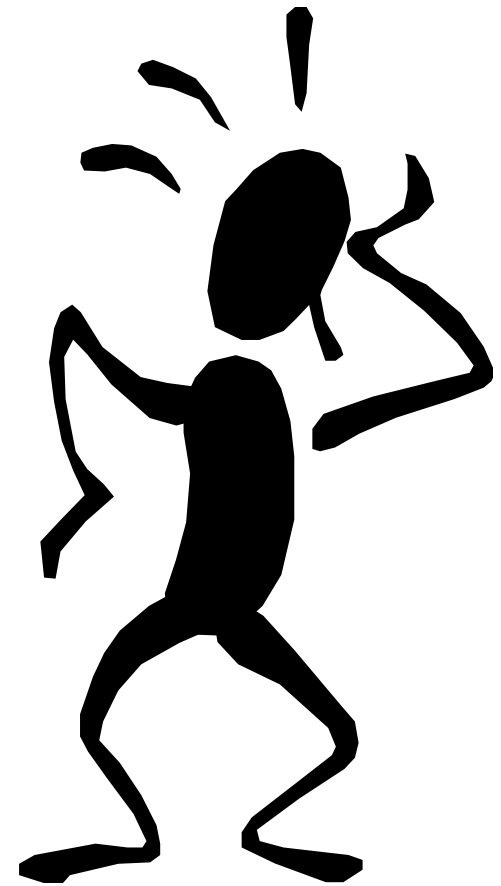

- ⌘ The TDSB is committed to a school system and workplace that is free of discrimination and harassment.



Show Respect & Responsibility



- ⌘ Be prepared, on time and ready to learn
- ⌘ Show respect for self, others, and those in authority
- ⌘ Do not compromise the safety of others
- ⌘ Follow rules and policies

Police Involvement



- ⌘ Uttering a threat to inflict serious **bodily harm** on another person;
- ⌘ Possessing **alcohol or illegal drugs**;
- ⌘ Committing an act of **vandalism** that causes extensive damage to school property at the student's school; or
- ⌘ Hate motivated violence
- ⌘ Extortion.

Mandatory Suspensions /Possible Expulsion

- ⌘ **Possessing a weapon**, including possessing a firearm;
- ⌘ **Using a weapon** to cause or to threaten bodily harm to another person;
- ⌘ Committing **physical assault** on another person that causes bodily harm requiring treatment by a medical practitioner;
- ⌘ **Committing sexual assault**;
- ⌘ **Trafficking** in weapons or illegal drugs;
- ⌘ Committing **robbery**;
- ⌘ Giving **alcohol to a minor**; or
- ⌘ Possession of an explosive substance

Code of Conduct Applies



- ⌘ On school premises
- ⌘ On field trips and any activities that are part of the school program
- ⌘ On school bus or any vehicle under contract to the board
- ⌘ Off school premises where conduct has impact on safety, security, or physical & mental well-being of any member of school community

Keeping Our Kids Safe at School Act



- ⌘ All School Staff must report serious incidents that could lead to suspension or expulsion
- ⌘ Principals must notify parents of victims when a student has been harmed

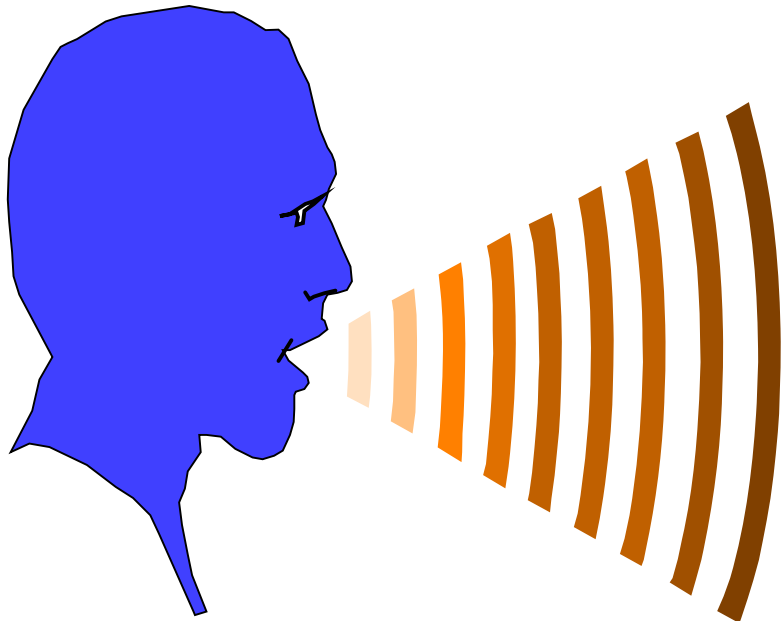

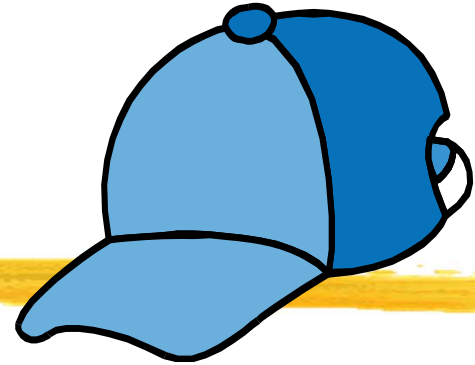

Code of Behavior

Headgear Policy



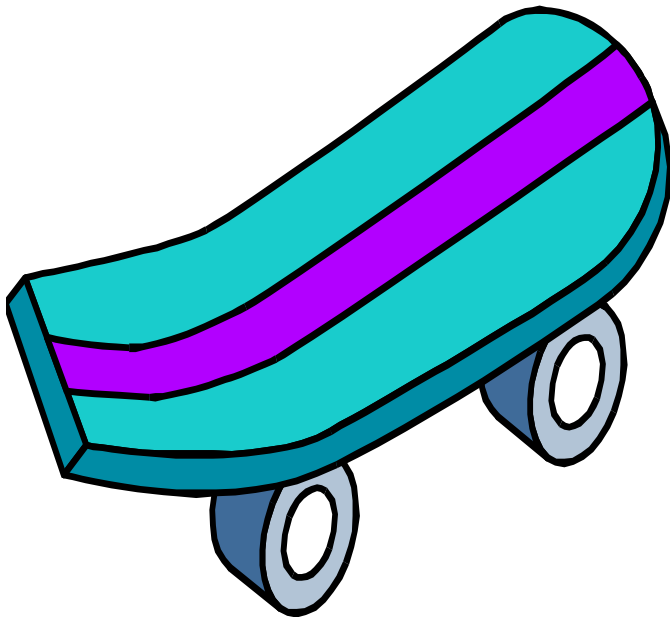
- ⌘ Each school must establish a dress code.
- ⌘ DMCI's School Council voted to implement a no headgear policy.
- ⌘ Policy states: "Students are expected, upon entering the building to remove their hats, bandannas or other non-religious head coverings.
- ⌘ Students ignoring this policy could be suspended.

Smoking Policy



⌘ **Smoking is not allowed by anyone (staff, students, parents and visitors) in school buildings or on school property at any time. Smoking is also not allowed in any vehicle on school property.**

Skateboards - Scooters



- ⌘ Students are asked not to bring skateboards or scooters on school property
- ⌘ Use of skateboards or scooters on school property can lead to suspension

Auto Issues



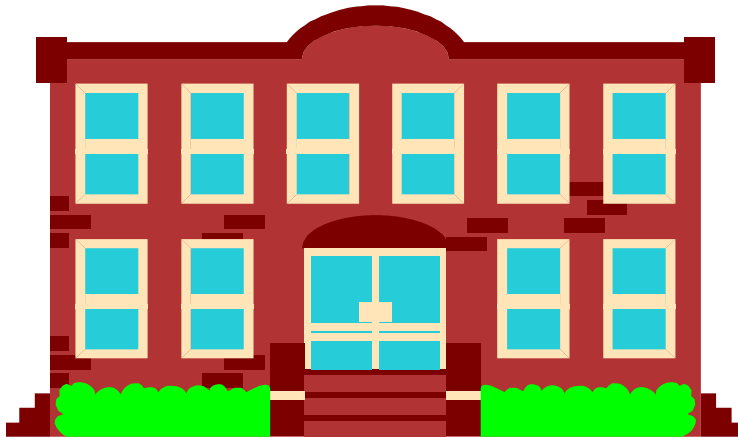
- ⌘ Driving to school is a privilege

Punctuality



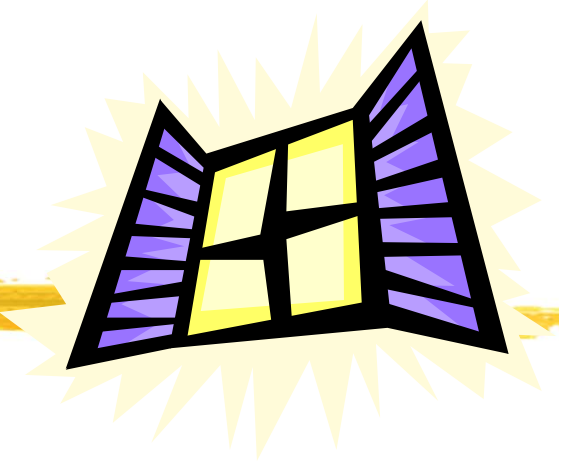
- ⌘ Arriving late disturbs the learning opportunity for others.
- ⌘ BE ON TIME!
- ⌘ When returning to class after an absence, submit a note of explanation to the teacher.
- ⌘ Sign in and out of the main office with a note.
- ⌘ Consequences for lates and absences

Care of Environment



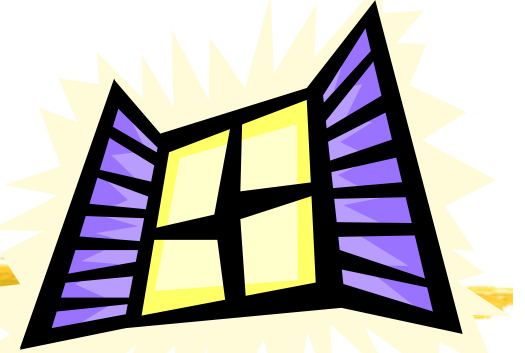
- ⌘ A healthy and clean facility.
- ⌘ Take precautions for the security of your own property.
- ⌘ Show respect and care for the property of the school and that of others.

Halls, Cafeteria, Rooms, Outdoors



- ⌘ No eating in classrooms
- ⌘ Basketball court
- ⌘ Middle school
- ⌘ Quiet study in library
- ⌘ Use the café to consume food and chat with friends

Halls, Cafeteria, Rooms, Outdoors



- ⌘ Students are to leave the school by 3:45
- ⌘ Many hallways will be off-limits during lunch periods
- ⌘ All students in the hallway during their class time must have a Hall Pass!
- ⌘ **15 Minute Rule – no leaving class during the first or last 15 minutes!**

Fire Alarms



- ⌘ When a fire alarm rings, you **MUST** leave the building
- ⌘ Stay with your class (no stopping at lockers, etc.)
- ⌘ It is a criminal offence to pull a fire alarm

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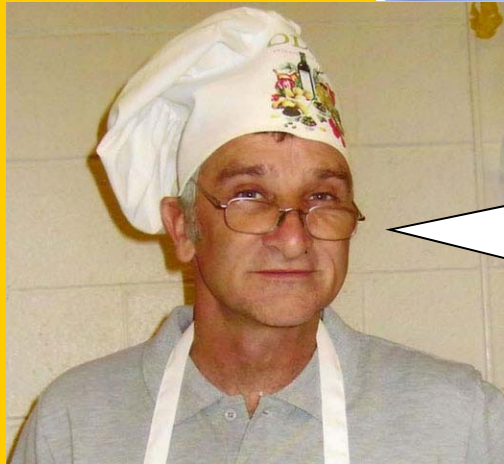

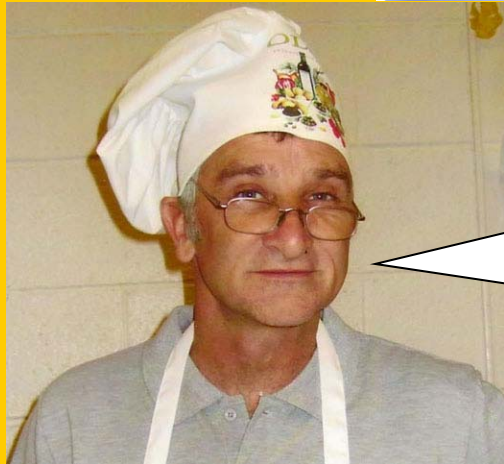
