## Donations for the Arts Programs at Don Mills CI

The purpose of this fundraising campaign is to help cover essential equipment and programming needs that fall outside the school's annual budget allocation.

Our space and stage is in urgent need of updated lighting equipment. We are still using original stage lights from the 1960s and 1970s. While these lights have served us well for many years, many are now obsolete and can no longer be repaired.

To properly support our productions, we need:

Approximately 20 new stage lights (ideally 40), at a cost of about \$700 per light — totaling approximately \$14,000

Four new dimmer packs for our dimmer rack, at \$500 each — totaling approximately \$2,000

A new digital spotlight, as our current one can no longer be repaired — approximately \$2,000

In total, our lighting upgrades alone will cost approximately \$20,000.

In addition, we also need to purchase new microphones and headsets for performances, at an estimated cost of \$1,000 or more.

Overall, we are hoping to raise approximately \$40,000 to support these immediate and long-term needs. Any contribution, large or small, is sincerely appreciated.

The musicals, performances, and Arts programs at Don Mills CI continue to provide students with inspiring educational experiences and valuable post-secondary pathways, and your support will help ensure these opportunities continue for years to come.

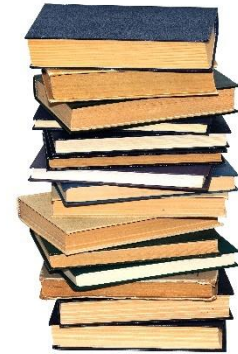
## CULMINATING ACTIVITIES POLICY

1. Attendance during the Culminating Activity period is mandatory. Many courses have activities that take place over several days and students must be present each day to participate. Participation is vital as a presenter and audience member (when applicable).
2. Any student discovered cheating on a Culminating Activity will receive a mark of "0". Further consequences may apply, refer to the student agenda pages 18 to 21 hard copy or the TDSB Connect App.
3. If you are unable to participate in or submit a Culminating Activity due to illness:
  - Phone the school 416-395-3190 *before* the Culminating Activity is due for submission or is scheduled and inform your teacher(s).

- Obtain a doctor's note specifying that you were too ill to complete a Culminating Activity on specific days.
  - Submit the doctor's note to your Vice Principal within two school days of the absence or submission date.
4. Students who miss a Culminating Activity will receive a mark of "0" unless an alternative evaluation is deemed warranted by the Principal. Students granted an alternative evaluation will receive a mark of "0" until they complete the alternative evaluation.



## Exam Dates and Culminating Activities



The exam dates are listed in the course outline/syllabus that students received at the beginning of the course. Please speak to the teacher directly for any questions.

For Culminating Activities (major projects/assignments/presentations) that do not fall during these dates, students are also responsible to make sure they complete these on the due dates. Please speak directly to the teacher for any questions about these assignments.

Moratorium is the 4 days prior to exams and only review work is done during this time unless there is no exam in that course. For example, if the course has an exam and a culminating activity, that culminating activity cannot be done within the four days of moratorium. However, if the course does not have an exam but it has a culminating activity, then that culminating activity can take place during the moratorium days. The moratorium days are from June 11-16. Please note that June 16<sup>th</sup> classes are shortened and, in the morning, only, with all English exams taking place from 1pm – 3pm.

## Missing an Exam

These rules are to help support students to prepare for all the expectations in any post-secondary institution and even in the workplace to show up and be on time. Balancing mental health and resilience is the factor here. We know exams can be stressful and now is the time that teachers are preparing all students for their final evaluations occurring at the end of June.

If a student misses an exam or an end of semester culminating activity, only a medical note from a doctor is accepted. The note must also express that the student was too ill to do the exam – or if it is a culminating activity then the note will state the student was too ill to


do the culminating activity. Students/parents/guardians/caregivers will also need to provide this note directly to the Vice Principals in that student's alpha: A-L: Mr. Vanek and M-Z: Ms. Baker. If a student misses an exam and/or handing in their culminating activity by the due date in any course without the medical note, the result is a mark of zero. Due to the timeline of these evaluations and the final marks being due immediately after, there is no makeup or credit rescue for these final evaluations. Please speak to your son/daughter to ensure you are also aware of all exam and culminating activity/final evaluation due dates.


Please do not book vacations for the students **during exam days or when culminating activities will take place**. Students **will not be** excused from **exams or culminating activities** because of a vacation during those days.

# OLTS-ONTARIO

**Register for OLTS-Ontario and give yourself a head start on success at college and university!**

On-Line to Success (OLTS)-Ontario is a transition program for high school students going into Grade 12 (or doing extra year) with learning disabilities, ADHD, ASD, and/or mental health disorders (such as anxiety or depression) who plan to attend college or university. This online course runs during the summer and guides students through various activities and assignments designed to prepare them for the challenges they may face in post-secondary school.

## How OLTS Helps

### INCREASE SELF-KNOWLEDGE

Gain more knowledge about your disability and how it affects your learning.

### BUILD SELF-ADVOCACY SKILLS

Learn how to get what you need, who to ask and how to talk to your professors.

### DEVELOP STRATEGIES

Gain and practice skills essential to post-secondary success, such as learning strategies, time management, stress management and more!

### LEARN ABOUT YOUR RIGHTS AND RESPONSIBILITIES

Discover the services available for students with disabilities at the post-secondary level, and what your rights are.

## COURSE SCHEDULE

The OLTS-Ontario course schedule is outlined below:

### **Opening Day: Half-day, Virtual: July 8, 2026**

Students attend a **half-day virtual** course overview and orientation sessions.

### **Online Modules: July - August**

Students complete the online course work. The course consists of online modules to work through. Students who don't complete the full course during this time period can continue to work throughout the summer.

## TRANSITION INFO NIGHT

RARC hosted a virtual Transition Information Night. The session provided an overview of programming, accommodations, and supports that can help students with disabilities prepare for the changes that come with post-secondary education. - Planning to attend any post-secondary institution
- Have a diagnosed learning disability, ADHD, and/or ASD; and/or be diagnosed with or self-identify as having a mental health disorder
