
# Step 2: Research Your University Options

- Check out university publications, websites and tours.
- Talk to counsellors, family, teachers and friends.
- Write down your program choices and codes, and keep them handy.


## Step 3: Mark Your Calendar

- October/November 2018: Schools distribute Access Code letters for the 101 Online Application.
- January 16, 2019: Deadline to submit your completed application to the OUAC.
- **February 5, 2019:** Recommended last date to make changes to your application.
- May 29, 2019: Latest date you can expect a response to your application for admission.
- June 3, 2019: The earliest date you may be required to respond to an Ontario university offer of admission and give a financial commitment (e.g., registration deposit, residence deposit, etc.).



# **Applying Beyond Ontario?**

- Go to <u>www.commonapp.org</u> for admission requirements and U.S. university applications
  - Students applying to the U.S. must write either the SAT (<u>www.sat.org</u>) or the ACT (<u>www.act.org</u>) – most schools accept both, but some prefer one or the other
  - Check the SAT and ACT websites for test dates. A common time for students to write the SAT is in March. However, the test is offered several other times throughout the year.
- Canadian citizens do not require visas to study in the U.S., students will receive a Certificate of Eligibility from their school
- Canadian students pay <u>International Tuition Fees</u> at U.S. universities


# **Scholarship Types**

### **Entrance Scholarships**


Based on marks, no application required

- Must apply and may be required to provide reference letters, personal essay
- Criteria may be based on a combination of: academic achievement, leadership, entrepreneurism, character, involvement in school and community
- Be mindful of deadlines can be as early as October 2018

- Can obtain an estimate using OSAP Aid Estimator from OSAP website
- NEW Free Tuition for those who qualify (based on family income \$50000 or less) when an application to OSAP is made, it will automatically be considered for Free Tuition
