As a high school student, you will have important choices to make that will open doors to your future, including the selection of your courses throughout high school.

## Academic (Grades 9 and 10)

- Cover the core content and have an emphasis on theoretical and conceptual learning
- Example: English - ENG1D


## Open (Grades 9-12)

- Learning expectations are the same for all students
- Designed to prepare students for further study and to enrich general education in a subject
- Can be counted as compulsory or elective credits
- Example: Health and Physical Education - PPL1O


## What Happens if My Child Does Not Pass a Course?

- Students may repeat the course in summer school research suggests this is the most effective way to "catchup" and move on to the next grade level
- Students may be recommended for "Credit Recovery" research suggests this is the next-best way to "catch-up"
- Students may repeat the course in the next semester or year - research suggests this is the least effective way for students to "catch-up" and move on to the next grade level

## Optional Attendance

- Students are encouraged to attend the high school within the catchment area of their residential address (home school)
- Use an Optional Attendance Application Form (PR545) when applying to a school other than your home school
- *Specialized Programs may have earlier deadlines* Please review school specific deadlines for more information.
- Forms will be available online and at the elementary schools in November.
- Specific information regarding Optional Attendance Procedures will be communicated to students and families in early January

## Optional Attendance

Students may apply to:

- up to 2 specialized programs and
- up to 2 regular programs
through optional attendance for a TOTAL MAXIMUM of 4 optional attendance applications.

- Forms need to be signed by the elementary school and then delivered to the high school before the deadline
- This is the responsibility of the student/parent
- Note: Some schools are closed to optional attendance for their regular programs (they don't have space available).

## French Immersion:

- 10 French courses needed for Bilingual Certificate (Immersion)
- 11 French courses needed for Honours Bilingual Certificate (Immersion)


## Common French Pathway Questions

2. Which French courses are mandatory?

- FIF1D5, FIF2D5, FIF3U5, FIF4D5, and 6 or 7 other FI courses that have a ' 5 ' at the end of the course code.

3. How do you get the right credits for graduation?

- Students should take as many FI credits in Gr. 9 and 10 that the school offers, because there are not many FI courses in Gr. 11 and Gr. 12.
- In Gr. 11 only 2 courses are available
- In Gr. 12 only 1 course is available.
