COOPERATION

Your child can show cooperation by:

- Playing and working cooperatively with others in the family.
- Working with others to complete a task and/or achieve a goal.
- Helping to find a compromise when there are family disagreements or disagreements with peers at school.

Questions to discuss with your child:

- What is cooperation, and what does it mean to be cooperative in a family?
- What are some things you do at home or at school that require cooperation?

Projects to do together:

- Make a list of things that your family does that require cooperation.
- Watch for situations in books or on television that demonstrate cooperative behavior and talk about the various ways in which the characters acted cooperatively with each other.
- Work together on chores at a time when members of the family can work together to finish them.
- Complete a fun project that involves all family members (e.g., putting together a puzzle, making a homemade pizza).

Encouraging co-operation in your child:

- Praise your child when they are cooperative.
- Help your child become aware of their own cooperative or uncooperative actions.
- Share your own experiences of cooperative/uncooperative actions and how it affected reaching a goal.
