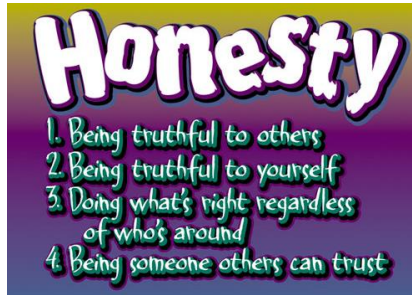

Your child can show honesty by:

- Sharing their feelings and being truthful
- Telling the truth, even though they may know that there will be consequences
- Being reliable and responsible in completing a job

Questions to discuss with your child:

- What does it mean to be honest? Discuss different ways to be honest with yourself, with your peers, and with others.
- What should you do if you need to tell the truth, but you know there will be consequences?
- How do you feel when someone else has been dishonest with you? What would you do?
- Once trust has been broken, what can you do to get it back? Have you ever lost someone's trust? Has someone lost your trust?
- What's the difference between being honest with your own family and being honest with someone you have just met?

Projects to do together:

- Watch TV shows or movies. Talk about the ways in which the characters were honest or dishonest with each other.
- Read stories related to honesty and discuss the importance of being honest.

Encouraging honesty in your child:

- Give your child opportunities to tell the truth.
- Make sure that you explain to your child that you always want the truth, even though they may be afraid that you might be upset.
- Encourage and praise your child when they are honest.
- Model honesty for your child.
