10 Have your child help you put away the grocery items. Talk about where each item goes (e.g., The fruit goes in the top bin).	11 Thanksgiving Day	12 Visit a pet store. Use your home language to talk about how the animals look. Use describing words such as big, black.	13	14 Read books that focus on adjectives (e.g., White Rabbit's Colour Book by A. Baker; Is it Rough? Is it Smooth? Is it Shiny? by T. Hoban).	15	16 Go for a walk. Find 4 things that are red, 3 things that are blue, 2 things that are yellow, 1 thing that is green.
17 Play the app "Trash Stash" and practice sorting items.	18	19 Collect some leaves, sort them into different size piles and talk about big/medium/small.	20	21 Talk about opposites in your home language (e.g., grand/petit).	22	23 Make a fruit salad. Describe the shape and colour of the fruit. Talk about the parts (e.g., seed, peel).
24/31	25 Categorize pictures from flyers and magazines (e.g., fruits and vegetables).	26	27 See how many action words you and your child can act out (e.g., jump, run, hop).	28	29 Find items that are opposites (e.g., big/little; tall/short; smooth/rough; hard/soft).	30
