Dear Parents/Guardians,

As most of you have seen in the first day packages, Cash Online is now being offered as an OPTION at Duke. It is not mandatory. It essentially works like a store - you can only purchase things online that have been posted by the school for purchase. Not every trip will be offered online, as sometimes timelines won't allow for it, so please log on and see if it is displayed. If you choose to pay the teacher directly, that will still be an option (cash/cheque payable to the Duke of Connaught) unless told otherwise.

Cash Online is NOT available for anything to do with the Nutrition Program (either hot lunch or for snack program) as this is a separate account and it will not be set up for payment <u>online</u>.
