Friday April 11th marked the first day of the National Sumdog Contest. Sumdog is a website with educational Math and Language based games (www.sumdog.com). The topics were:

Examples:

Medieval Era - Laws based on the Magna Carta

Egypt - Preservation of bodies - Mummification Process

Rome - Aqueducts and Soap

China - Paper and gun powder.

The Roman Government:

How Rome changed from a Monarchy to a Democracy to a Dictatorship.

The Role of Women:

One based on the Medieval Era and the other on the Handenosauni society which is Matriarchal or Matrilineal.

Warriors of the ages:

A Roman Guard, a Gladiator, a Viking, a Knight, a Native Canadian and an Aztec Warrior.

They brought a number of artifacts, some REAL and museum replicas for the children to see and touch. They also brought lights and music to help create an environment that transported the children in time. This presentation was excellent in allowing the students to learn by seeing, hearing, acting and touching the items they brought and displayed.
