

- * Our goal for transition planning includes
 - Educating ourselves (school AND families AND students) about supports, services and agencies beyond the school
 - * Helping to make the connections to these supports



The Eastdale Process

School courses leading to OSSD/C or Certificate of Accomplishment Focus on the development of key skills: academic, social, employment Co-operative Education placements to get ready for work /volunteering / community involvement

Connection to community agencies and supports



Post-Secondary Education Options

- * Students with an OSSD may be eligible to apply to college programs.
- * Program eligibility will depend on the courses.

OSSD	OSSC / Certification of Accomplishment
College programs Workplace and possibly college level option	College programs: College Vocational (GBC) CICE (e.g. Humber, Durham, etc.)

Researching Post Secondary Options

All Ontario Colleges and programs can be searched easily through the Ontario Colleges website: <u>www.ontariocolleges.ca</u>

All students also have access to a comprehensive search through MyBlueprint: <u>www.myblueprint.ca</u>. Eastdale students can set up their account with Mr. Perry

Applying & Paying for College

- Most college programs are eligible for OSAP (grant & Loan) funding.
- Depending on family income, many students will qualify for grants that would cover most or all of the tuition cost
- * Eligibility for Bursary for students with disabilities

Developmental Services Ontario (DSO)

What is it?

When to apply?

Central organization Starting at 16 that manages access to all government-funded Will assess for

that manages access to all government-funded services for adults with developmental disabilities

- Decides who is eligible for services
- Keeps a waitlist and referral for services
- Operated by Surrey Place, in Toronto

Will assess for eligibility (psycho-educational report, plus proof of age and where you live)

Then have to wait for an assessment of needs (up to 24months!), then wait for the funded service (2-4 years, or sooner with urgent need)

Who gets it?

18+, with a developmental disability

Most students with an MID designation will be eligible, but not all.

ODSP – INCOME SUPPORTS

What is it?

Social Assistance (income) for adults living with a disability.

Can include money for basic needs as well as money for rent

Can also include health benefits (drug card, special diet, dental, etc.)

When to apply?

6 months before 18th birthday

Will assess for

- Financial eligibility
- If DSO eligible, then you are ODSP eligible.

Who gets it?

- 18 and over
- Financially eligible (less than \$40,000 in assets)

Must show you have a disability. DSO letter of eligibility is enough proof of this.

ODSP – EMPLOYMENT SUPPORTS

What is it?

Money & Service to help people with a disability find and keep work

Can include: Job coaching & training interpreter services Specialized computer training Tools and equipment

The services are provided by an agency that the individual chooses from a list. When to apply?

Usually towards the end of high school.

- Application form
- Proof of disability (DSO letter of eligibility will count as proof).

Who is gets it?

16+. You do NOT have to be on ODSP to be eligible.

Must show you have:

- A disability .
- The disability makes it hard for you to find or keep a job
- You have to be "competitively employable".

PERSON-DIRECTED PLANNING

What is it?

Helps students to make a plan for life in their community by choosing goals and finding connections, services, and supports with the help of families and/or other people of their choice. Can include:

- finding volunteer or work opportunities
- Building independence
- Linking to services

When to apply?

Before age 18, if possible

However service can be accessed at any time, usually for a fee

Who gets it?

This service can be FREE for individuals between 14 and 18 who have a developmental disability

After 18, it can be purchased, or funded through DSO eligibility.

RESPITE SERVICES

What is it?

a short planned break from the physical and emotional demands involved in caring for a family member who has a disability.

- Includes some camp options (march break, summer)
- Some overnight
- CHAP worker

When to apply?

Under 18 if diagnosis of developmental disability

18 if eligible for DSO

Who gets it?

18 years + and eligible for services through Developmental Services Ontario (DSO)

Under 18 must have a diagnosis of a developmental disability including autism and/or a physical disability, visual or hearing impairment.
