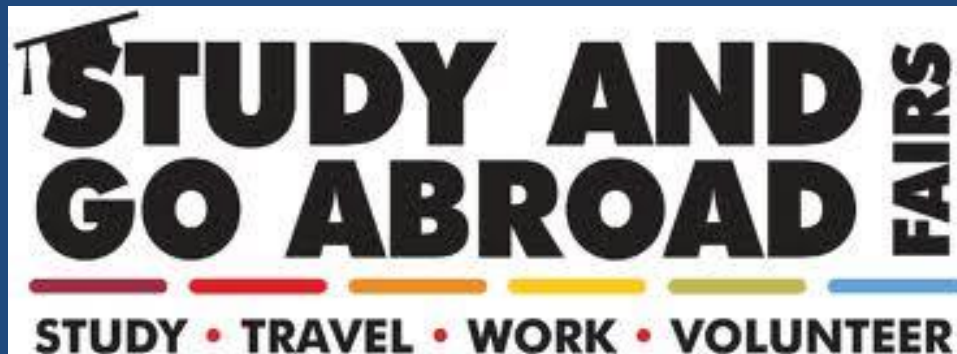



WHAT TO ASK AT THE FAIR

- How many applications do you receive for this program? How many spots are available?
- What program are employers looking to hire from, but not enough people enroll in?
- Scholarships are calculated based on the offer of admission. Are they re-calculated (up or down) based on my final marks?
- Are most students who are accepted coming straight from high school, or do they have work experience first?
- Do required courses go into the 6U/M calculation, or do I just need to have them? (*Universities*)
- Residence: Guaranteed? Format? Co-Ed bathrooms? Meal plan required?

NEXT STEPS:

- **Check your graduation progress in myBlueprint**
- **Check program requirements for your post-secondary pathway**
- **Attend the downtown Info Fairs – gather materials and ask questions**
- **Attend the EYCI Pathways Fair – ask follow-up questions related to your specific areas of interest**

NEXT STEPS (CONT...)

- **Apply as early as possible!**
- **College students create their own accounts and can start applying in early October.**
- **University students are waiting on PIN numbers available in November.**
- **Workplace candidates are encouraged to attend school workshops and career fair opportunities throughout the year.**
- **Apprenticeship candidates should begin exploring college programs and searching for supervisors as soon as possible. Consider OYAP opportunities through Co-Op for the Fall.**

FINAL THOUGHTS:

- Ask questions from the experts
- Visit the schools
- Explore beyond academics
- Check colleges, even if you are set on universities
- Ask for money! There are many scholarships and few applicants. Start early and keep applying.
- Check your OUAC/OCAS accounts for mark/course accuracy
- Expect to be fully qualified by the end of June. Seek help from Student Services if you are in need of a summer school extension.
- Check you email and post-secondary accounts regularly. Read everything and act immediately. Timelines and expectations vary from school-to-school and program-to-program!
