



NEXT STEPS (CONT...)

- Apply as early as possible!
- College students create their own accounts and can start applying in early October.
- University students are waiting on PIN numbers available in November.
- Workplace candidates are encouraged to attend school workshops and career fair opportunities throughout the year.
- Apprenticeship candidates should begin exploring college programs and searching for supervisors as soon as possible. Consider OYAP opportunities through Co-Op for the Fall.
