Principal's Message

Tips to Help Your Child Be Successful

As the new school year gets underway, it's appropriate to stress the important role parents play in their child's education. The importance of schools and parents working together for the sake of children cannot be emphasized enough, especially in these elementary years. Here's how you can help:

- Teachers always appreciate positive and supportive parents. Communicate with your child's teacher. Keep abreast of what's going on in the classroom. Find out more about what subjects are being taught. Let the teacher know that you are willing to help out with activities as your schedule allows. Show your support of Fairglen and our programs. Why not participate on our School Council and see how you can make a difference?
- <u>Children need to learn responsibility.</u> This is a life skill that will prove invaluable to them throughout their school years and into adulthood. Home is the first place that children learn responsibility. As a parent, you have a critical role to play in helping your child become a responsible adult. Work with your child's teacher to see to it that assignments and homework are completed on time and in a responsible manner.
- Homework is an opportunity for children to practice what they learned at school. It's important that you make it clear that you believe homework is important. Homework also teaches children important skills such as following directions, being organized and working on their own. Ask your child about school and homework every day. Let the teacher know if there is a continuing problem with homework.

Remember that as a parent your attitude is contagious – if you demonstrate a positive attitude and a strong interest in learning and self-improvement then your child will model the same traits.

Learning Skills and Academics

On November 11, 2019 your child will be receiving their Ontario Progress Report Card. This is the report card that lets you know how your child is doing in certain subject areas thus far. One of the most important parts of this progress report is Page 1. This page describes how successful your child has been in their work habits and learning skills.

There are six learning skills and work habits evaluated on your child's report card:

- Responsibility
- Organization
- Independent Work
- Collaboration
- Initiative
- Self-Regulation

These skills and habits are emphasized because they are essential to your child's academic success. Classrooms will work on developing these skills and habits through success criteria, discussions and games. Nevertheless, your support in the development of these skills and habits is crucial. You can help at home by making sure your child brings their agenda to school every day, by helping your child identify goals at the beginning of each term and then checking in at the end of each week to see if they are on their way to achieving their goal and by talking to your child about how you have used these skills and habits throughout your day.

Successful Parent-Teacher Interviews:

As parent teacher interviews are upon us, we encourage you to take this opportunity to find out about your child's progress. Parent-Teacher Interviews will be taking place on the evening of Thursday, November 14 and on the morning of Friday, November 15. Below are some questions and tips that you may find useful for the interview.

Great Ouestions to Ask

- What skills does my child need to work on?
- What activities can we do at home to strengthen those skills?
- Does my child complete his/her work and assignments efficiently and conscientiously?
- Is my child facing any struggles in class not related to her/his schoolwork?

Interview Tips

- Talk to your child about school before the interview. Ask how they think they are doing and how the teacher can help them meet their goals.
- Get an idea of what the curriculum is like, the level your child is working at, and areas where they are struggling.
- Make a list of what you want to know before you go into the interview. You can even prepare questions ahead of time if it will make you feel more at ease. Knowing what you want to know and writing it down ensures that you don't forget anything, and that you get the information you need.
- Be open and honest. Feel free to add your own observations around your child's behaviour, strengths and weaknesses.

- Find out what they're learning. Ask curriculum questions, find out what your child has learned and what is coming up in the term ahead. Know the skills your child will need to be successful in the term ahead (i.e. knowing how to multiply and divide fractions).
- Ask about strengths and weaknesses and possible problems. Find out about problems before they happen. This information will allow students to get help before they fall behind.
- Find out how often and how much homework is being assigned as it relates to the TDSB's Homework Policy. Also ask if your child is completing his/her homework regularly, how long the work assigned should take to complete and does the teacher check the homework regularly and provide feedback. The answers to these questions will help you better monitor your child's work habits.
- Ask what you can do at home to help your child. Make a commitment to support your child's learning.

Remembrance Day

On November 11th, at the 11thhour, in 1918, an Armistice was signed that marked the end of World War I, the Great War. This war caused the death of 16,000,000, and the world was suffering from high war exhaustion. Canada in particular lost 61,000 brave soldiers who fought for Canada and the world. Many of these soldiers were young men, some of them even teenagers.

Many of the soldiers that died in the war were never identified, as there was no evidence of who they were. On Remembrance Day, Canadians remember the soldiers that died in the war, both named and unnamed. Lest We Forget.
