## Did you know...?

### Director of Education

In 2016, the Board of Trustees hired John Malloy as the new Director of Education. John brought significant change by grouping all TDSB schools into **four Learning Centres**. This model enables us to be more responsive to student needs and bring education resources closer to the classroom. **Willowdale is part of Learning Centre 2**. I will be hosting a public meeting about Learning Centres in October where you'll have a chance to **ask questions and interact with the Director**. See the full list of planned Ward Forums below.

### Integrity Commissioner

The TDSB was also the first school board in Canada to hire an **Integrity Commissioner**. This role helps to improve TDSB governance and accountability. It allows you and the general public to engage directly in that process. ### Aboriginal Education

Starting this year, all schools across the district will begin their day with an **acknowledgement of the ancestral lands and territories of Aboriginal communities**. The TDSB is committed to equity and reconciliation. This is an important step in supporting Aboriginal students and reflecting on the importance of Aboriginal Education and traditions in Ontario. ### Special Education

The Toronto District School Board (TDSB) will be introducing a **universal screening process for all Grade 3 students** this year. The purpose of the screening test is to:

- Provide information to classroom teachers about the strengths and learning needs of each student;
- Help teachers to know when to bring a student forward to the In School Team (IST) or School Support Team (SST);
- Improve equity of access for all students to programming including students with a gifted exceptionality.

The Special Education Advisory Committee (SEAC) will launch an anonymous survey to gather feedback from parents and guardians about Special Education at the TDSB. The committee is dedicated to improving communication with parents and students about special education program options, complaint resolution and greater accessibility at the TDSB. Step Three

Superintendents are responsible for a Network of Schools. They support school staff and can be contacted if you have questions that have not been answered or for help with:

- Alternate attendance request
- Suspension appeals
