Ontario Youth Apprenticeship Program – Applications due Friday, November 5

Accelerated OYAP is an intensive one-semester program that combines a co-op placement with an 8-week block of Level 1 training at a College or Union training centre. An Accelerated OYAP student becomes a Registered Apprentice with the Ministry of Labour, Training and Skills Development.

Credit Rescue – Friday, November 5 and Wednesday, November 10 – Supporting Students At Risk of Not Meeting Curriculum Expectations

Credit Rescue is an early intervention initiative to support student achievement. Only students who have been contacted by their teacher, Special Education or Student Success departments will attend in-person (or virtually if the student is a simultaneous learner). Teachers will pause regular classroom activities for these two designated days and will focus on Credit Rescue activities.

There will be two Credit Rescue opportunities for students in November as follows:

- Friday, November 5 for Week 1 Classes
- Wednesday, November 10 for Week 2 Classes

Students who are not participating in Credit Rescue will be expected to work on subject-related material while remaining at home on both of these days. Please note that all grade 11 students will be writing the OSSLT on November 10 at school – more information follows below.

Note: This additional November Credit Rescue Day will result in one fewer Credit Rescue Day at the end of the semester in January. See this <u>updated school year calendar</u>.

EQAO – Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test – Grade 11s – November 10

All grade 11 and non-graduating grade 12 students will be required to write the Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test (OSSLT) on Wednesday, November 10 at school. All students who are required to write the OSSLT in November, along with their parent or guardian, were sent an email communication about this two weeks ago.
